FOUR PRISONERS BROUGHT FROM SUTHERLIN TODAY

Sheriff Starmer last night lost five of his star boarders but today took in four more so that the balance is very nearly equalized in numbers at least. Bert Cook and George Daniels, of Sutherlin, were brought to the city this afternoon and lodged in the county jail on a charge of burglary. They are alleged to have entered the service station conducted by J. W. Leitzel at Sutherlin, and to have taken \$18 in cash and a number of articles bringing the total loss to about \$25. They were taken into custody this afternoon and are alleged to have confessed.

Two others were brought in from Sutherlin, a formal charge not yet having been placed against them.

According to the story told to the officers Lester Garrett of Sutherlin purchased an automobile from his wife's brother, James Sanders of Tacoma. The automobile was supposed to be in storage at Santa Barbara. The bill of sale and other papers were delivered to Mr. Garrett, but when he called for his car he found that there was no such machine.

Mrs. Sanders and her husband had been having marital difficulties, it is stated, and she has been staying at the home of her brother.

Last night the Sutherlin marshal caught a man named E. P. Lenoir, of Tacoma, peeping into the Garrett home. Sheriff Starmer says. Lenoir when arrested told the officer that Sanders was just around the corner and that he was trying to attract Mrs. Sanders' attention, as her husband wanted to talk to her. Sanders was arrested and both men brought to Roseburg. A charge of obtaining money under false pretenses will probably be brought against Sanders.
