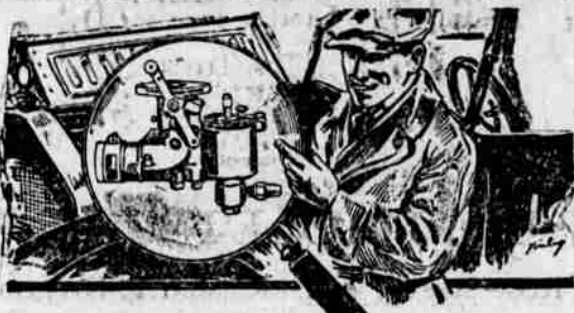

## MORE OVERLANDS NEEDED FOR 1926

Production of the Four-Cylinder Overland, the light car product of Willys-Overland, will be 50 per cent greater for 1926 than during the past year, which was the record year for this model in the history of the organization.

The first indication of greater developments in the four-cylinder Overland came in September of last year, when the price on the standard sedan was dropped to \$595, the lowest price ever put on a four-cylinder enclosed car with standard features of design and equipment including three forward speed sliding rear transmission, honeycomb radiator, heavy frame construction and standard-size body specifications.

This price brought a volume of sales which exceeded by a large percentage the ability of the factory to keep production up with demand.

The acceptance of this sedan at the price established was an immediate indication of a sales field which had never been sounded by any manufacturer of a standard type four-cylinder car.

The total volume of sales in this four-cylinder model for the entire year of 1925 was over 100,000 cars, including all body types, of which there were four. The sales volume in this four-cylinder model was reached in the face of a total volume of six-cylinder cars, Overland and Willys-Knight, sold and delivered during 1925, which exceeded 100,000 units.

At the present time, the price on the Overland four-cylinder standard sedan is still the lowest in the field.

During the past year, despite two drastic price reductions, the quality of materials and finish entering into the construction of this product, have shown steady improvement. The standard sedan model, which has been the leader in the price scale, is now offered with a nickel-plated radiator shell, polished lacquer finish, cow ventilator, one-piece windshield and 20 square feet of total glass area in the body.

## DUCO FOR YOUR CHEVROLET CAR

Arrangements whereby the 6500 Chevrolet dealers throughout the country will be enabled to give complete service to the motoring public are now being worked out in detail with E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Company, according to J. P. Little, manager of the parts and service division of the Chevrolet Motor Co.

Heretofore Ducco service has been available only through distributors and refueling stations of the du Pont organization. Under the new plan each Chevrolet dealer will be equipped to do all classes of Ducco work, from minor "touch-up" operations to a complete refinishing job.

Complete Ducco equipment has been installed in all of the 29 Chevrolet service schools in the United States for the purpose of demonstrating to every Chevrolet dealer the importance of properly equipping his shop to service Ducco.

During the last few months every Chevrolet service promotion and used car representative, together with all Chevrolet parts managers and service school instructors, have been given complete training courses at the Chevrolet factories in the use of Ducco equipment.

Chevrolet dealers may send men from their service departments to any Ducco distributor for training in the application of Ducco, and they have been assured also of the co-operation of more than 50 du Pont company field service men.

With installation of equipment, dealers will be able to re-finish their used cars for ready re-sale, to give quick service on Ducco finish to patrons and to build up good will by their ability to maintain the appearance of customers' cars.

The Chrysler Corporation and the Fedco Number Plate Corporation, which manufactures the patented number plates which appear on the instrument board of every Chrysler car, are determined to take every step possible to prevent the theft of Chrysler cars and to prevent the sale of stolen Chrysler cars.

The Fedco company has retained the William J. Burns International Detective Agency, with its thousands of trained investigators and 36 offices throughout the United States and Canada, to cooperate with police authorities in making it more difficult to steal Chrysler cars and to sell stolen Chrysler cars. Rewards up to \$5,000 are now offered through the Burns agency for information leading to the arrest and conviction of anyone who has stolen a Chrysler car, sold a stolen Chrysler car, or purchased a stolen Chrysler.

From all parts of the United States to the Chrysler factory in Detroit come reports of how the patented number plate on the car has prevented the sale of stolen Chrysler cars. A professional criminal in Richmond Hill, New York—a suburb of New York City—stole a Chrysler roadster, removed the entire instrument board and attempted to sell the car with another board without a plate. The absence of the plate was noticed, an officer called and an arrest made.

Another auto thief in New York

found it impossible to change the serial number on the instrument board and found it impossible to make a counterfeit plate. He then tried to disguise the fact that the car had carried a plate. The absence of the plate resulted in his arrest also.

Edward Geo. McGarra of Newark tells how his Chrysler car was stolen, how he notified the police and how it was recovered three days later. The motor hood had been removed from the car as well as the license plates. But the police had no difficulty in identifying the car because of the Fedco plate.

New York's police department uses 27 men as an automobile squad to combat the activities of auto thieves in the city.

Twelve thousand cars were stolen in New York in 1925. In Chicago 8,112 cars were stolen last year, an increase of 53 per cent over 1924.

## MORE FORD TRUCKS THAN ALL OTHERS

The year 1925 witnessed the biggest sale of Ford ton trucks in the history of the Ford Motor Company, according to a sales statement just issued by the company. The total for the year was 217,112 units, an increase of 16,826 over the sales of 1924. This mounting demand for Ford trucks was accounted as due largely to an increase in truck buying by the agricultural districts of this country. The American farmer, one of the most logical users of the ton trucks, is now coming into the market stronger than ever before and indications are that 1926 will see a marked rise in the number of trucks of less than two tons capacity on American farms.

Other figures indicate that more than 60 per cent of all trucks in use during the past year were Fords. In the less-than-two-ton class, 71 per cent of all makes sold were Fords.

Four standard types of truck bodies on the Ford Ton Truck chassis comprise the line for the new year. A stake body, especially adapted for farm and other use requiring accommodations for heavy, bulky loads and three express types are versatile enough to cover every field of ton truck haulage.

One of the express bodies features low sides while another is of the canopy top and curtained sides type. The third is screened with canopy top and protecting curtains. Open and closed cabs also are provided.

One new commercial body style was developed during 1925—the pickup body—designed to take the place of the rear deck of the Ford runabout for light weight haulage in which speed, light weight and easy maneuvering ability are dominant factors. The runabout seat affords comfortable riding for the driver and there is ample room for another passenger. Full protection against inclement weather is provided by the ton and side curtains which open with both doors.

## 216,552 CARS ARE OWNED IN OREGON

With a total of 216,552 motor vehicles registered for the year 1925, Oregon stands 28th among the several states of the United States in automobile registrations and 30th in rank of increase in registrations for 1925 over 1924, according to a statement received by Secretary of State Koser, Oregon's rate of increase for 1925 over 1924 was 12 per cent, as compared to 9.3 per cent for California and 10 per cent for Washington.

## MAN ON TRIAL FOR BLASPHEMY

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

BROCKTON, Mass., Feb. 10.—Anthony Himba of Brooklyn, N. Y., faced district court here this morning, the first man in this city's history to be tried on a charge of blasphemy. In addition he is accused of making seditious utterances.

So much interest has been aroused in the case, unique in modern Massachusetts legal annals that spectators were on hand from several states.

Taking cognizance of wide interest in the case, Clerk of Courts Charles H. King declared that the trial "will not be a vaudeville stunt."

"The aim of the Brockton justice," he said, "is to mete out justice honestly, without regard for public opinion."

Among organizations which have come to the aid of Himba, who stands accused of having advocated the overthrow of the United States government by force and with having denied the existence of God in an address in Lithuanian hall here on February 3, are the defense council of New York and the civil liberties league of Chicago.

The law under which he is being tried, was enacted in 1697 and superseded a previous statute which made death the penalty. The present law carries a possible penalty of \$500 in fine or a year in jail for blasphemy.

Himba, a lecturer, declares that the charges against him are the result of a nation-wide conspiracy and that he would have been arrested if he never came to Brockton.

## GEN. PERSHING CONDITION BAD

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla., Feb. 10.—General John J. Pershing passed through here today. His condition is serious but not alarming, was the word given out when the Havana special, 25 minutes late, made a three-minute stop.

General Pershing rested well during the night. He was having breakfast in his private car as the train passed through.

## LIQUOR CASES NOT DISMISSED

SEATTLE, Feb. 10.—Judge Neter here today refused to dismiss liquor conspiracy charges against Stewart I. Richardson and Benale Goldsmith, co-defendants of Roy Olmstead. The defense thereupon began its opening statement to the jury, the government having rested yesterday.
