ROSEBURG DISPLAY WINS THIRD PLACE AT EXPOSITION

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Feb. 26. — Roseburg was awarded a banner for third place on its community exhibit at the Educational exposition. Exhibits from various communities consisted of pictures, displayed in an artistic manner, a plan used for the first time since expositions have been sponsored by the college.

The Roseburg exhibit consisted of pictures of Mt. Thielsen, Diamond Lake, the North Umpqua river, highway of the county, industries of Roseburg, and agricultural districts throughout the county. A panorama of Roseburg was also shown. Burton Hutton, of Roseburg, junior in commerce, was in charge of the display.

First prize was awarded to the exhibit displayed pictures and information concerning the community. The Independence exhibit was given second place.

In past years it has been customary to display products of the county, but this year the exhibits were limited to pictures. Such displays, it was considered, would be of less cost to various localities and at the same time give the impression desired.

CONGRESS ASKED FOR MORE MONEY TO OUST UNDESIRABLES

WASHINGTON, Feb. 26. — An appropriation bill carrying \$79,847,000 for the departments of state, justice, commerce and labor was reported to the house today by its appropriations committee. The amount is \$2,555,000 above last year's bill, but \$39,480 below budget estimates.

The state department is allotted \$16,478,000; justice \$24,026,000; commerce \$29,735,000 and labor \$9,536,000.

The committee increased by \$1,000,000 the budget estimate of \$6,984,000 for the bureau of immigration, explaining that it would provide for continuation of the deportation of aliens and that maintenance of the Canadian and Mexican border patrols "at an efficient strength." The appropriation contemplates a force of 1800 men for that purpose.

The committee informed congress that the time has arrived when consideration must be given to the overcrowded condition of federal penitentiaries and urged the house to provide for additional prison facilities.

DAWES CRITICIZED BY ONE DEMOCRAT, UPHELD BY ANOTHER

(Associated Press Special Wire.)

WASHINGTON, Feb. 26. — The methods of Vice President Dawes as presiding officer of the senate have been criticized again, and this time, with Mr. Dawes making no answer, a democrat has come to his defense.

The criticism came from Senator Reed, Democrat of Missouri, who, shaking his finger at the vice president, yesterday, notified him that the gavel would not be used in this senate to cut off the rights of senators. The Missourian referred to a situation of the day before, when Senator Blewett, Democrat of South Carolina, had sought to be removed from a decision of the chair ruling out of order his motion that the senate reject the conference report of the bill.

Senator Reed contended that Mr. Dawes had "gavelled" through another motion and had shut off Senator Blewett. The vice president listened closely to the criticism but made no reply.

Senator Robinson of Arkansas, the Democratic floor leader declared, however, that there was not "the slightest reason for denouncing the chair for the use of the gavel yesterday." He maintained that the vice president had been correct in his ruling.
