TRIP FROM DRAIN TO COOS BAY 30 YEARS AGO TOLD

Hardships of Travel in
Coasts District Told by
Former "Drummer"—
33-Hour Journey.

Modern conditions of travel are vastly different than those of a few years ago as shown by an article published in The Travelers Bulletin. The article was written by Charles M. Hough, describing his trip made from Drain to Coos Bay 30 years ago, while he was employed as a traveling salesman or "drummer" as he was known in those days. The article will be of interest to those who can draw a comparison between the times as described by Mr. Hough and the present. His story follows:

Hardware was my line and San Francisco my home port. After working the Valley, Portland and the surrounding towns, I thought the time was about ripe to a trip to Coos.

Now, be it known that at this time there was no railroad into Coos Bay and a very poor boat service. About once in two or three months the old Alsea took her way to San Francisco; would advertise a call at Coos; sometimes she would make it O. K., and then again if the weather was at all stormy, she would have to be outside of Coos Bay waiting for the sea to be smooth enough to enter, for it was a bad one. (Most bars, though, if they heard were bad; then if the captain grew weary in waiting, away he would sail for the Golden Gate, carrying passengers and freight, if he had any, to San Francisco, to be later sent back on some steamer plying between the two points, for boats ran between San Francisco and Marshfield at least once and often twice a week, so to all intents and purposes that part of Oregon was California. Their lumber, coal, butter, cheese, etc., all went south, and in turn they drew all of their supplies from the Bay City.

Well, this is not getting anywhere, so "Let's Go," but, mind you, mates, as Mr. Gregory, the sports writer, would say, am not to take a luxurious sleeper here at 5 p. m., and say Mr. Potah: Call me for Marshfield in the morning.

I left Portland one stormy Sunday night via the Southern Pacific for Drain, at which point I was to take the stage the next morning towards the coast; lucky for me the train was light, so I soon found myself, stowed away in a double seat in the smoker and was soon enjoying to the fullest extent my old blar. About 11 p. m. the brakeman woke me up from a sound sleep with a remark, "Next stop will be Drain." I piled out to find that the rain had turned into a wet snow, not a very nice prospect ahead. I managed finally to reach the so-called hotel; no nice, clean, nine-foot sheets to climb into in those days and in this instance I had to be content to drop into a nest which had just been vacated by a party who had taken the train which I had just left. Five o'clock came all too early, but as the stage was to leave at 5:30, I had no time to lose. Sure enough, while still not through breakfast, came a stentorian voice, "All aboard." So with a final gulp of the delicious Arbuckle coffee and soggy bread, I was ready. I found that the stage was a dead sea wagon, canvas covered, with spring seats and blankets for robes. Mr. Mattoon, or rather Peter, we will call him, was handling the reins over four fiery steeds. The rain and snow had made—Oh what a road! In most places nearly hub deep, so that the pace was made was painful, in fact never out of a slow walk. To test our weary bones, after being tossed about in the stage, Peter would occasionally let us rest by walking up a young mountain. Finally, about 1 p. m., we drove into the village of Elkton, taking some seven hours to cover a distance of about sixteen miles. Dinner was all ready for us and we were admonished "to make it snappy," as we had many a mile to cover yet before night. Oh, boy! How good that hot and hominy and hot corn bread did taste, at least I thought so, for coming from the "Show Me" state, that was my long suit. The noon meal over I hid myself across the road to advise the Beckley Bros. (Charles and Pat) that I would appreciate an order on my return in about a week. They promised me one and I was good, as they also did in many a later trip. Fine boys, those I understand that they are now ranching near Roseburg and I hope are doing well. Now came Pete with fresh horses and his cheerful "All aboard for Scottsburg." I think we only took one singletree on the way which, considering the road we had to go over, was, I thought, doing pretty well. As I nigh drew on, an how tired and sleepy I got; occasionally my head would drop out only for a moment, for being it would go against a wagon bow and I am afraid that at times the air got just a little bit blue; but all good things have an ending some time; so it was in this case. About 12 o'clock we saw the welcome light of the Palmer House, Scottsburg. We fell out of the stage, climbed out and in a moment found ourselves in one of the most cheerful rooms that I thought I ever saw—plenty of big easy chairs and old fashioned log fire throwing out a welcome heat and a couple of bowls of soup, apples on the center table, after that 18-hour ride in which we had covered 25 miles, no wonder I thought I was nearly in heaven and was looking forward to such a good night's sleep, when

from one corner of the room arose the tall form of Captain Cornwall, the skipper of the stanch little steamer Eva. His remarks were certainly to the point and he didn't stutter a bit, as he spoke thusly, "Now your supper is all ready; so hurry, as we are late, and have to get an early start from Gardiner in the morning, so as to catch the early tide down the beach."

I was hired to sell goods, not to sleep, so there was nothing to do but buckle to it. Just a word right here about the Palmer House, kept at that time by Mr. and Mrs. Palmer, assisted by their handsome and industrious daughters, the latter living in or near Portland at the present time. I can truthfully say that in some 25 years on the road I never saw its equal, for the simple reason that they did not try to run a hotel, but a home for the weary traveler and a "resting place" that those girls made was a dream.

Soon the delicious midnight repast was over and Daddy Palmer drove us all down to the boat. How he did was a mystery to me, for you actually get to your hand in front of you. I and another passenger dickered for the only two berths and I was soon dreaming of home, sweet home. That boat, after about a two-hour's run, tied up at Gardiner at 5:30 a. m., and then put off for the month of the Umpqua. The captain kindly brought a sandwich for my fellow passengers and myself, so we had the privilege of sleeping until near Winchester Bay, or the river's mouth. As there was no such thing as finding place, we stood off from the shore and finally reached the latter by means of a skiff. Even the small boat could not reach real terra firma, so here came Dave Holden, the beach driver, in his hip boots. "Get on my back," and we each got on his back and were soon once more on terra firma.

Now we are in for about a 10-mile drive along the beach and much easier on the anatomy than the drive of the day before. Wide-tired wheels kept them from sinking in the sand, and occasionally Dave would actually get his legs used into a trot. By 1 o'clock we were in sight of Coos Bay. A small steamer plying between Empire and Marshfield picked us up and at 2:30 p. m. it dropped us off at the dock in Marshfield. We North Bent in those days with the exception of Simpson's mill, ship building plant and a small store, mainly for the employees. I think it would be needless to say that a dish of fried-out-of-the-sand razor clams, right to the queen's taste at the Blanco Hotel, helped to fill a large vacancy. Thus ended our 23-hour's trip from Drain.
