FRENCH BUDGET BALANCED AFTER 2-YEAR EFFORTS

Chamber of Deputies Votes Enough for Surplus at Same Time—Sinking Fund Comes Next.

(Associated Press Special Wire.) PARIS, April 1.—The French budget is finally balanced after two years of efforts in which four cabinets and six finance ministers have fallen. The Chamber of Deputies concluded an all-night session by voting new resources sufficient to wipe out a surplus of between 30,000,000 and 60,000,000 francs. This success is looked upon as assuring the continuance of the Briand ministry for several months at least.

The vote on the combined measure was 224 to 159, a majority of 77, with 190 deputies abstaining. The senate is expected to pass the bills promptly without essential amendments, thus ending the first phase of France's effort to restore her finances.

The second phase will open when parliament meets after the Easter vacation. Finance Minister Perot will then introduce measures to finance a sinking fund to take care of the inter-allied and domestic debts.

(Associated Press Special Wire.) PORTLAND, Ore., April 1.—Ted Thye, Portland club instructor, defeated John Kilonis, Boston Greek, in two-out of three falls here last night. Thye won the first fall in eleven minutes with a flying wrist lock and head scissors hold. Kilonis won the second fall with a Boston crab hold in 27 minutes 20 seconds. The third was won by Thye in 31 minutes.

La Barba Beats Sencio. LOS ANGELES, Cal., April 1.—The laurels of a decisive ten round victory rested today upon the brow of Fidel La Barba, youthful world's flyweight champion, who, last night, for the second time, turned back Cleyver Sencio, dark skinned challenger from the Philippines. La Barba's title was not at stake as last night's battle for both the fighters entered the ring at 116 pounds, four pounds over the flyweight limit. In it the champion demonstrated the superiority that was at doubt after their first meeting a few months ago.

Students to Chase Paper. EUGENE, Ore., April 1.—The University of Oregon will be represented in the intercollegiate paper chase which is to be held at the Portland hunt club Saturday. Those who will participate from Oregon in competition with four other teams of six each are Kate Martin, Peggy Spencer, Nonie Vial, Johnny Nelson, Helmie Hall and Jack Herring.

U. of O. Adds Coach. EUGENE, Ore., April 1.—Edward P. Abernethy, swimming and tennis coach at the University of Oregon, has signed a one-year contract to continue as coach in the two activities.

Woods vs. Hand Again. EUGENE, Ore., April 1.—Sailor Jack Woods, light heavyweight wrestler, is in Eugene training for a bout with Ralph Hand, local grappler, on April 9. The event will be staged at the armory. Cecil Barreck, a protégé of Woods, will meet Wildcat Pete of Eugene in the semi-final.

LUMBER COMPANY PROTESTS HIGHER RAILROAD RATES

(Associated Press Special Wire.) WASHINGTON, April 1.—The California White and Sugar Pine company requested the Interstate Commerce Commission in a brief today to dismiss the petition of western railroads for rate increases on lumber as they affect charges on lumber from the California and southern Oregon rate groups.

Considering the average length of haul, the manufacturers' brief said the California and southern Oregon lumber groups already were paying more than their share of the transportation burden. Any increase, it was added, "would curtail shipment and thus reduce rather than increase the revenue of the carriers engaged in its transportation."

FRAGMENT OF PAINE'S TOMBSTONE SOUGHT FOR RETURN TO AMERICA

LIVERPOOL, April 1.—The Society of Lovers of Old Liverpool is searching for a fragment of the tombstone of Tom Paine, author of "The Age of Reason," the "Rights of Man," and other books, so that they can restore it to America. J. M. Dow told members Tom Paine escaped from the French Revolution, came to London and then returned to the United States. Congress presented him with a 50-acre plot at New Rochelle, New York State. He died in 1815 and shortly after his burial his tombstone was smashed by vandals on account of his anti-sectarian views and writings.

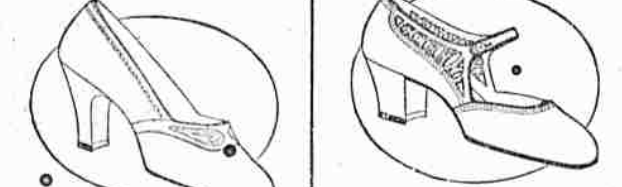

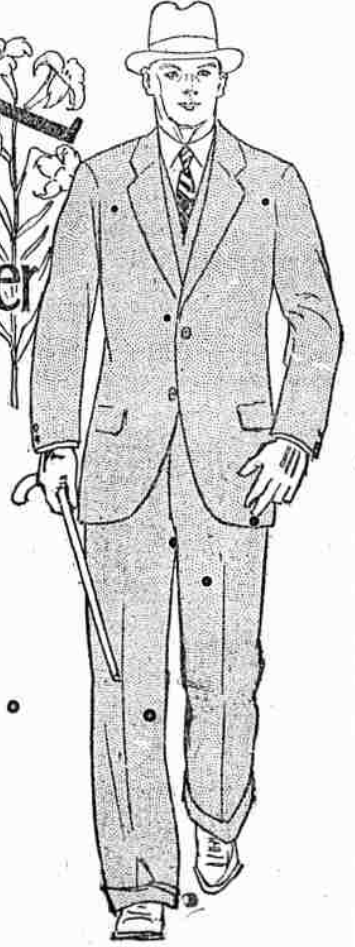
