BROCCOLI GROWING AT GRANTS PASS IS SUCCESSFUL

GRANTS PASS, April 1.—Although rather disappointing because of the drought of the last month, this year's broccoli experiment has proved successful from other standpoints than the monetary return. The plantings this year were made to give the growers some idea of what can be accomplished here in broccoli growing and to demonstrate the best varieties.

The crop came through the winter in excellent condition, showing that this variety is well adapted to its production. It was shown that a good market could be secured. In the face of huge shipments from Roseburg and California. But best of all, a way was found to get away from marketing at the time the other sections are making their peak shipments. Through the planting of late Ashby seed, the crop

can be brought to maturity after the greater portion of the Roseburg and California stuff has gone off the market, giving the producers the benefit of an advancing market. In normal years, broccoli production should be a profitable undertaking.

Producers have also found that it is best to confine their plantings to a smaller acreage and to fertilize and cultivate intensively, which will give them a larger acreage return and just as large a total return.

FILTHY WHISKEY STILL IN MARION COUNTY IS SEIZED

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
SALEM, Ore., April 1.—State, federal and county officers last night seized a whiskey still operated by Arthur Jette at Champco, about 300 miles of moonshine, 200 gallons of mash and brought Jette to Salem where he was lodged in the county jail.

The still was of 80 gallons capacity. It was far from being a sanitary outfit, the officers say, and the accumulation of filth and dirt was heavy.

William Levens, state prohibition commissioner, led the raid. With him were D. D. Tow and Lloyd Linville, federal men who had located the plant, and Deputy Sheriff Roy Bremner.

Jette claimed he had been operating about three months, running off an average of 40 gallons of moonshine daily. Most of it, he said, was sold in Portland and Newberg.

NORTHERN LINE IN OREGON SOLUTION TO RATE PROBLEM

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
SALEM, Ore., April 1.—The State Public Service Commission, in a brief prepared in proceedings involving proposed freight rate increases on roads operating in the west, suggests increase in tonnage rather than increase in rates as a solution.

The quoted testimony of Vice-President Woodworth of the Northern Pacific, and says: "It is shown that the primary cause of the difficulty so far as the western lines are concerned, and particularly the Northern Pacific and Southern Pacific lines, lies in the fact that the northern lines thus far have failed to complete their branch lines to the heavy stands of pine timber available for transportation in central Oregon and that such of the Oregon timber that is being marketed is being hauled by the Southern Pacific company over a circuitous and uneconomical route."

"We believe Vice-President Woodworth was correct, when he said that through proper divisions of sections the Southern Pacific company could better afford to turn much of the western Oregon traffic over to the northern line for direct transportation east than to haul it over existing routes."

PRUNE HOLDINGS ARE LIGHT IN THE NORTHWEST

PORTLAND, Ore., April 1.—Notwithstanding recent slumps in the prune deal, holdings in the Pacific northwest are lighter than is usual at this time of the year. A generous estimate of the holdings in Washington and this state would be 2,000,000 lbs. The Northwest Prune Growers' Ass'n. has about 750,000 lbs., and the Clark county association has probably twice as many, while the rest are scattered in small lots.

The present situation is outlined by M. J. Newhouse, manager of the Northwest Prune Growers' Ass'n. as follows: "Some recent transactions have given the Atlantic coast buyers a wrong impression of the situation here. There are no large lots anywhere in the country. "There is a demand in Europe for small-sized prunes, but these are practically no supply left. Nearly all of our prunes are of large size and they are too high-priced to ship abroad."

Reports from all sections indicate that the prune trees are in perfect condition. The discouraging condition is that the trees are so far advanced. When they shoot, early bloom there is always danger of frost or of cold rains damaging the forming fruit. Should the blossoming period pass without danger, this earliness will get the fruit off the trees without danger from the fall rains.

The man and child were found in Riverside, Cal., and possession of the little one was obtained there by Mrs. Isbell. Later the superior court here gave her custody of the child. She had lived at the hotel for about two months.
