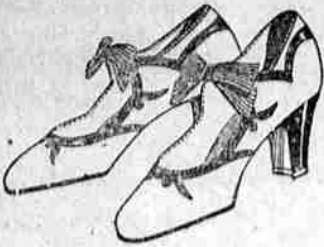

HIGH SCHOOL TO HAVE GOOD TENNIS TEAMS THIS YEAR

The Roseburg high school students are taking a great deal of interest in tennis this year. The high school courts have been put in shape and practice has already begun. Leach of the state dairy and food department. Miss Betts speaks tonight at the Dillonville grange hall, tomorrow night at the Melrose schoolhouse and Saturday night at the Green grange hall. Miss Betts also is speaking to assemblies in the grade schools of Roseburg and at points throughout the county wherever possible. Her talks are being arranged in this county by the County Health Unit.

DEMOCRATS MEET, "SUGGEST" HANEY FOR SENATORSHIP

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) OREGON CITY, Ore., April 8.—Clackamas county democrats, meeting yesterday, endorsed the principle of the income tax, opposed entry of the state into the hydro-electric business, and favored reduction of automobile license fees and abolition of many state boards.

Bert E. Hanev was suggested as Democratic candidate for U.S. Senator, and in case Hanev does not enter the contest, the following were proposed as alternatives: Marshall N. Dana, Portland; H. G. Starkweather, Clackamas and Hugh McLean, Coos county.

W. C. Culbertson was suggested as Democratic candidate for representative of the first congressional district.

MUSSOLINI GIVEN FRENZIED OVATION BEFORE SEA TRIP

FIUMICINO Italy, April 8.—Premier Mussolini was given an ovation on his arrival here today to begin his voyage to Tripoli.

As he boarded the dreadnaught Cote di Cavour, the crew was lined up on the deck and in the rigging. Bugles were sounded and the men greeted him with hurrahs while sirens shrieked and other warships in the harbor saluted.

Police and carabinieri had a hard struggle to protect the premier from his admirers and it was with difficulty that he reached the pier.

All about him the people surged, applauding and shouting "Viva Mussolini!" "Viva Il Duce!" and "Viva Fascismo!"

VIENNA, Austria, April 8.—A dispatch from Padua, Italy, says that Fascist students of the University in Padua this morning attacked and badly mauled their foreign fellow students, demanding their immediate expulsion from the University and from Italy.

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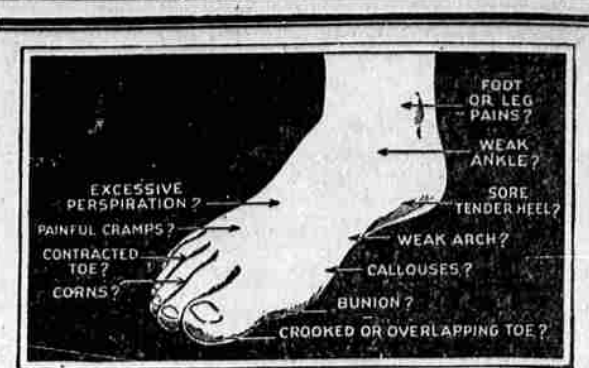
