WITH ONLY FEW STRIKES CALLED

shire and Scotland. The movement, characterized as "purely a precautionary measure," is to assist the police in maintaining order during the miners' strike.

CARDEFF, Wales, May 1.—Orders have been received at the docks of South Wales to suspend the exportation of coal ships which have already sailed are being ordered by wireless to return. This is known here to mean that the government has taken over control of the coal supplies.

PASSAIC, N. J., May 1.—New Jersey's riot act was unimpressive today, having been nullified by an injunction granted to textile strikers.

Albert Weisbach, strike organizer, said the injunction meant a cessation of his "red-baiting" in Bergen county.

The injunction is temporary, until May 10, when arguments will be made to making it permanent. Some ten thousand strikers have been on strike three months.

NEW YORK, May 1.—Extra police stood guard today over all prominent public officials, public buildings, places of worship, and the homes of wealthy and prominent men to prevent possible May day acts of violence on the part of radicals.

Despite these precautions, it was expected by police officials that no violence was anticipated.

The homes of J. P. Morgan, John D. Rockefeller, John D. Rockefeller Jr., Charles D. Clark and Helen Manning and a host of others were guarded. All the prominent offices also were under guard, a large squad being stationed about the Italian consulate.

Several communists and socialist leaders were kept under strict guard and guards were instructed to prevent circulation of anarchist, left and revolutionary literature.

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TREASON CHARGE

PLACED AGAINST YANK IN IRELAND

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

CORK, Ireland, May 1.—Patrick Garland of New York, who was arrested at Queenstown with alleged incriminating evidence, is to be tried for treason, being accused of conspiracy to overthrow the government of the Irish Free State. He is held without bail at Dublin.

He was a fireman on the Lusitania when it was torpedoed. He had documents when arrested indicating that negotiations were under way in the United States for the purchase of machine guns, it is stated. Other communications addressed to prominent Republican leaders in Ireland also were found on him.

Garland was arrested when he landed in Queenstown from the steamer Adriatic. The documents were found suspended under his shirt from a string about his neck. He said that he intended no wrong doing and if he had known of the contents of the package he would have burned it.

One letter dated April 16 and written on stationery headed "Irish Republican Army Headquarters in the United States," says that "there is a general feeling of apathy and inactivity and little or no money coming into the office," owing to lack of information regarding the Irish situation.

It added that while a majority of sympathizers and workers did not agree with the policy of Eamon de Valera, "ninety-nine per cent of them would not stand for nasty things to be said of him. Ask him."
