SEATTLE INDICTMENTS ACCUSE POLICE TRIO

SEATTLE, May 13.—Three Seattle policemen, including Captain E. L. Hedges, commanding one of the patrols at Central Station, and Lieutenant George H. Comstock, head of the dry squad, were named in 37 indictments returned by a federal grand jury here yesterday.

Patrolman W. J. Morrison of the dry squad, and Edwin T. Hunt, head of the Seattle finance company, and a former policeman, were indicted.

Hunt was indicted on a charge of conspiracy to violate the national prohibition act.

The Seattle Finance company is a concern to which Roy Olmsted, former lieutenant of Seattle police, who was convicted here February 20 with 20 others, and his wife Elise, turned over their property.

Sheriff William Gookins of Island county was indicted. Gookins telephoned from Coupeville, the county seat, that he would arrange bond.

WORLD WAR DEVICE USED TO EXTERMINATE PESTS

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., May 13.—Burners with a 24-foot swath, not unlike the flame throwers used in the World war, have been called into service in the Tule Lake section to fight grasshoppers which have already done damage estimated at \$5,000. The burners are drawn by tractors across egg beds of the insects and according to County Agent C. A. Henderson have already done sufficient to assure eventual annihilation of the pests.
