DYMENT STANDS BY HIS POLICY AT UNIVERSITY

(Continued from page 1.)

Eugene most of the time since February, 1926. I was quite aware that a faction of the regents, who are themselves divided, had turned upon me. So I came back from Italy two weeks ago to ascertain why, and upon reaching Buffalo was informed that this faction had forced a majority vote for termination of my tenure.

"The decision was kept secret for some reason. I understand there is no minute of it even in the public record. Accordingly, there is no official statement of the reason for this decision, but from various sources I have gathered the following:

Policies Defended.

"I was accused of being a Canadian and consequently of being likely to introduce foreign policies into the college of literature, science and arts, of which I was dean. (The college is by far the largest of the various units, as it contains 22 departments and teaches about two thirds of all the student hours of the resident been conducting star chamber sessions for nearly a year past.) I could not explain that I have been a voter in this state for nearly a quarter of a century, having come here as a young man.

"As for introducing foreign policies, I have at all times carried out only the policies of the late president, one of the finest Americans in Oregon history.

"The regential faction above mentioned also asserted that there was a serious difference of opinion between myself and two or three colleagues on certain university policy.

Favors One Governing Body.

"The policy in question was as to the unity of the university. The institution is in a period of marked expansion, and I have contended that for some time yet it should remain a unit under government by the general faculty, instead of being split up into a number of independent units, this latter being a step that would seem to weaken the university, when it needs concentrated strength. The dean of university college, who was myself, would naturally have profited most from such a decentralization, but I resisted it for what seemed the good of the institution."

Meddling Alleged.

A hearing before the board of regents was granted Dean Dymont more than a year ago. It was learned from other reliable sources yesterday.

It is understood that at that time several members of the faculty presented their cases against him, charging him with unwillingness to co-operate and inability to confine his activities strictly to management of his own department. Dean Dymont in turn appeared before the board to inter-rogation and told his side of the case and was asked questions by the board in regard to charges made by other faculty members.

When he asked for a leave of absence a year ago, there was a movement in the board to make the leave permanent. It was learned. He took his leave a year ago in April and it was understood by many members of the board that he would not return. Consequently no further action was taken.

Early this year, it is understood, the board received information that he was coming back. The matter was again taken up and he was given a chance to resign which he declined. At the last meeting of the board he was given a permanent leave of absence.

DIGGING BEGINS FOR BEER BURIED SIXTY YEARS AGO

Minnesotans Decide Not to Wait on Volstead for Decision on Legal Status of Quest.

HENDERSON, Minn., May 14.—Forty barrels of beer, buried in a hillside sixty years ago, is the "treasure" sought by four young men of Henderson who start digging for it today.

Charles New, owner of the brewery which was rated last summer, gave the men permission to slink a shaft in an effort to locate the beer.

Jacob Ritter, original owner of the brewery, stored the beer in a cellar thirty feet underground sixty years ago. Soon thereafter, the tunnel leading to the cellar caved in and no attempt has been made since to salvage the beer.

Old employees of the brewery have figured out the approximate location of the beer. The youths have a rube chart showing that by digging down and for thirty feet they will enter the tunnel leading to the cellar. They face one hazard, however, in Andrew J. Volstead, author of the federal law which bears his name and legal adviser to the Northwest Division Enforcement group, who last autumn decided to look into the legality of unearthing the beer. His decision has not been announced.

The youths, however, have decided to proceed and await a decision later.
