

Though Stelwer had the endorsement of the Anti-Saloon League he also had the endorsement of certain fraternal organizations which are reputed to have a "wet" leaning.

Stanfield, though earlier in his political career had been regarded as a liberal on the liquor question, alienated the wet element when he became a militant dry in the senate.
