"NATURE'S THORNS."

People look forward to the camping trips and hikes and picnics and various out-door affairs of the summer, as pure and unalloyed pleasure. But when they come to participate in these happy times, they frequently find their joy obscured by some of the minor annoyances of nature. Writing in "Association Men" under the title of "Nature's Thorns," Alvin F. Harlow talks about the sorrows which these travellers encounter from mosquitoes, buffalo gnats, black flies, sand flies, ticks, fleas, etc. He tells of many connections with which one can anoint one's skin, and secure protection against these pests. But even if one never leaves his home, there are in most places some local pests that make picnics or even sitting on one's porch uncomfortable. It is amazing how some communities that are all overrun with mosquitos, will tolerate them, when they could probably be abolished by proper treatment of the low and swampy spots where these creatures breed. Back in the days when most people kept horses and were very careless about looking after their stables, it was amazing the way they would tolerate flies. These pests would flock in vast swarms from the stables into the homes. Even if the doors and windows were carefully screened, a flock of these little beasts would be waiting at the doors, and every time anyone entered, scores of them would gain admittance and make a bee line for the kitchen and dining room. Well screened houses and covered garbage pails will do much to abolish such pests, and towns should get after mosquito breeding places. While people who are fretted by these pests may seem to lack self control, it is not wise to cultivate such restraint about them that we allow them to give us disease.

A new type of job for young men and young women has developed during recent years, as counsellors at boys' and girls' camps. An enormous number of boys and girls are attending such camps, and it takes a very large number of counsellors and leaders to take the direction of these youngsters. These counsellors need to have good judgment, and they need to take their job seriously. Some of those who have tried this form of work have gone into it mostly for the good time, and failed to realize that the health and welfare of these children, which are so precious to their families, are entrusted to these camps, and they must watch over their little flock carefully. Athletic and enthusiastic young people are needed, who sympathize with the kid element and can make them do things. Those who would rather ride than walk, and loaf than swim, and sit in hammocks rather than climb mountains, would better stay at home.

Classes for boys and girls who have had but few opportunities, are maintained in many clubs and associations. It seems a tragedy that there are any "under privileged children." This is supposed to be the land of equal chance, where the doors are opened to all. But unfortunately millions are born into homes where the parents can or will do little for them, and the chances that should be theirs never come to them. There should be some way opened by which all such ones could have their chance. Many more of them could have it now, only their families do not understand how to get it for them. A little more money for good clubs for boys and girls could open up doors of opportunity here in Roseburg.

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BEAUTY CHATS

A NEW BATH LOTION

The most important thing about bath water is that it be soft, for hard water is not cleansing and simply irritates the skin and makes it feel harsh. Therefore anything that softens water is a valuable beautifier. The chief value of bath salts is that they make the water deliciously salt and a good soapy lather possible.

You can soften bath water by throwing in lumps of soda, but the only danger is in getting too much, for strong soda is worse for the skin than hard water. I should like to suggest a very pleasant and inexpensive bath lotion made as follows: Take an ounce of benzoin and add to it two ounces of white vinegar, just the ordinary good quality cooking vinegar. Put it in a bottle and let it stand for a week before you use it, keeping it in quite a warm place. A few drops in the bath water is all you need. It has a very pleasant odor, it does not dry the skin, it is also slightly bleaching, and has the added virtue of being inexpensive.

Several people have written me that they like the oatmeal bags so much. These also soften hard water and soothe the skin, and are really no trouble to make. Some people like a mixture of equal parts of oatmeal and bran, but it has no more virtue than oatmeal itself. These bags are often made with one part powdered or finely shaved castile soap to two parts oatmeal. I do not specially advise this, because it seems easier to make up the bags without it and to use soap in the ordinary way.

Of course no bath is more stimulating or healthier than hot sea water, which can be had at home by purchasing bags of sea salt and adding a generous amount to your bath water. Salt water makes the use of soap impossible, but it is so cleansing this does not matter. Rub the skin vigorously with a rough cloth or scrub it with a small brush, and it will be as clean as it could be with hot water and soap.



Bath water should always be soft.

Test. Try a fine quality oil cream, one made from almond or olive oil. You can use this for your powder base just as well as the vanishing kind, just a little bit worked into the pores with your finger tips, and wiped off before dusting the powder over your skin. If you are not sure of the quality of your cream, you had better use a fine quality of olive oil or almond oil.
