ASSOCIATION MAY MARK SPOT WHERE FAMILY WINTERED

First White Family in Douglas County Spent Winter Months Near Oakland

L. P. Manning, a former resident of Roseburg, now residing at Graham, is spending a few days visiting in this city. Mr. Manning is first vice-president of the Douglas County Association of Portland and due to the death of the president of the association will preside at the annual picnic to be held at Peninsula Park on June 13.

Mr. Manning is anxious that a large number of Douglas county residents attend the reunion and picnic. It is always a pleasure, he says, for the former residents to be able to meet and associate with those who are making their homes in Douglas county, and the association extends an invitation to all residents to join in the picnic and meeting on the 13th.

Mr. Manning hopes that at the coming meeting he will be able to get definite action upon a project which has long been in his mind. He is personally acquainted with the place where the first white family spent the winter in Douglas county. That family, he says, wintered near Oakland, and he is one of the few men alive who know the location of the place where they stayed during that trying season. This family, he said, was forced to exist through the winter without flour and for a part of the time without salt. An overland trip was made to Scottsburg during the middle of winter and \$16 were paid for one pound of salt. Mr. Manning has proposed that the association erect a suitable marker at the site, and a committee has made an investigation and will report at the coming meeting. He desires to see the spot plainly marked and recorded as one of the historic spots of the county.

He also desires to see a marker placed in Whitmore Bay, north of Oakland. At that spot, in a space of less than 100 feet all travel north and south through Douglas county has passed. The old trails from California into Oregon, the old stage road and now the state highway all have gone through that gap, and it should have a special historic significance because of that fact, Mr. Manning says.

TO SCHOOL BOARDS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY

This being the teacher contracting season, a marked increase of lengthened school term is noticeable this year, which is a great improvement over the custom of employing for only the minimum term of eight months. When the custom of eight months term prevails, the rural pupil is compelled to complete the state course of study provided by the state in eight months, while the course is designed for nine months' work. In other words the rural pupil who attends the schools of only eight months' length of necessity passes out of the grades, having received the schooling amounting to seven years, whereas those pupils attending the schools of nine months' duration have the complete schooling of eight years. This office is very desirous that every rural school add the ninth month to the school term as rapidly as possible.

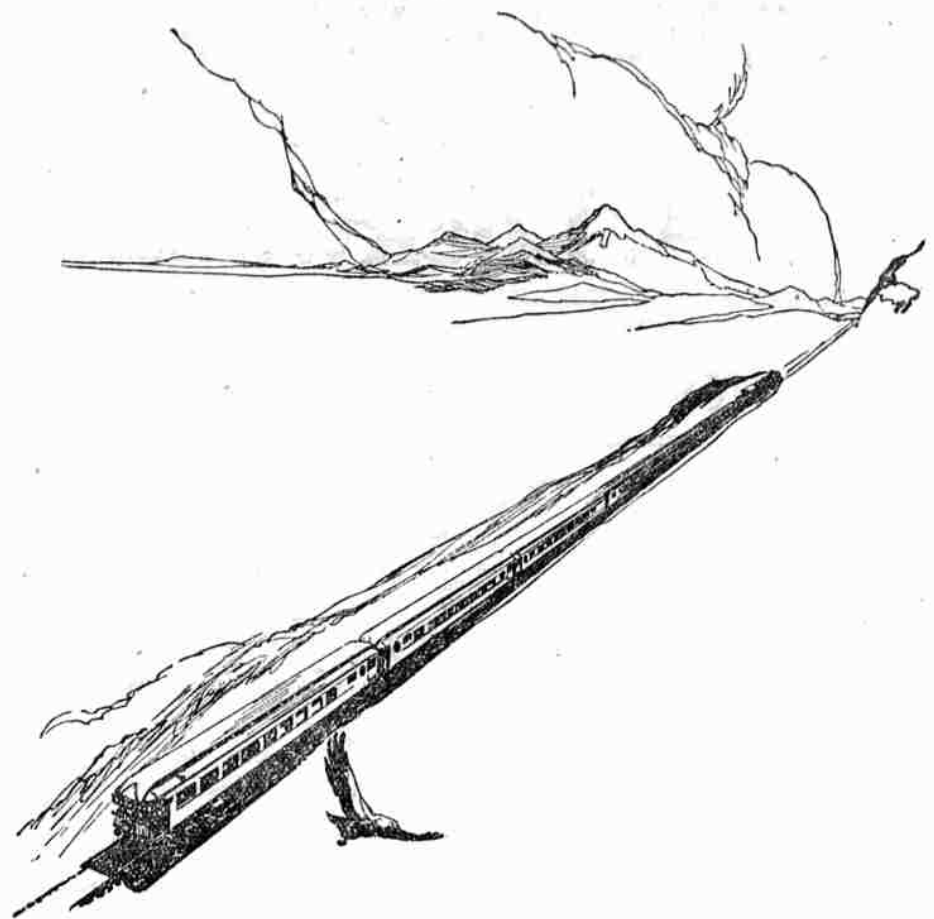

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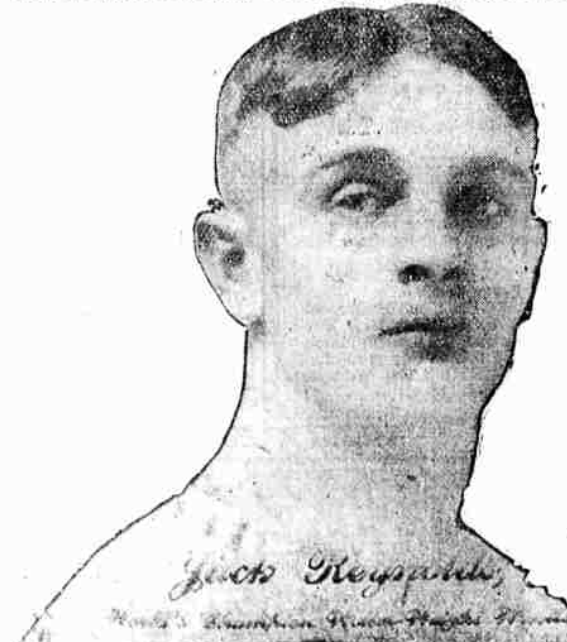
