

SPREE LEADS TO DEATH OF FOUR; FIFTH IS DYING

Marine Steward at Houston Slays Three Outright, Then Himself.

4 OTHERS ALSO SHOT

Jealousy Believed Motive of Killer Who Leaves Note of Farewell to Relatives.

HOUSTON, Tex., June 7.—Corra Robinson, negro maid, died at a hospital here today, the fourth victim of R. R. Tarter, steamship steward, who killed three others and then killed himself.

HOUSTON, Texas, June 7.—Jealousy, fanned by a prolonged drinking spree, is said by police to have been responsible for four deaths early today in a Houston suburb with a fifth fatality momentarily expected. Two white men and a negro woman were also wounded in the shooting.

Bob P. Tarter, Port Arthur States merchant marine ship out of Port Houston, is charged by eye witnesses as the slayer. Tarter's body was found among three dead

body was found some three hours after he ran amuck, a pistol near his body.

According to Anderson Beckman, one of those injured, they gathered at the Milam home Sunday afternoon "to drink some beer." Later, he said, Tarter came in, followed by Johnny Domingg and William Soulier.

Five Shot Down.

"Tarter left the room," Beckman's alleged statement said. "Edna (Mrs. Milam) and Domingg saw

together. When Tarter returned to the room, he drew a gun and started shooting at Downing. Downing fell and Bob shot Edna. She fell and as Sonnier tried to run he was shot down. Alce Ladaolai jumped up and was shot, falling over Sonnier.

Suicide Follows.
Police and sheriff's deputies were summoned by neighbors who heard the noise and upon being told that Tarter did the shooting, a search was instituted in the channel area. The report of a flash of a pistol shot led the officers to a place where Tarter's body came to a stop.

Three young women were arrested and are being held for questioning.

"Square Shooter," He Says.
Officers searching Tarter's home

Names given in the note are believed to refer to shipmates. The Mr. and Mrs. Blinsen referred to have not yet been identified.
