TWO ESCAPE INJURIES AS CAR TURNS OVER

DENTIST PAYS \$500 FINE FOR LIQUOR PERMIT ABUSE

PORTLAND, Ore., June 16.—Following the imposition of a \$500 fine by Federal Judge R. S. Benn today upon E. L. Carter, a dentist on the charge of possession of liquor, to which he pleaded guilty, Deputy Prosecutor Miller E. McGilchrist included a statement to the effect that there has been considerable tendency to misuse alcohol permits on the part of young doctors and dentists, and arrests on such charges in the future will probably be made the basis for prosecution under charges of manufacturing intoxicating liquor.
The charge against Carter was based on the discovery by federal agents that he was using alcohol obtained as a professional man under federal permit to manufacture "synthetic gin."
