BORING HOLES IN VOLCANO IN SEARCH OF INFORMATION

ROSEBURG, July 1.—Scientists are endeavoring to know more about the Klamath volcano and especially about the conditions existing on the island of lava, and boring a network of holes around the vast crater.
The holes are being bored with compressed air drills, and are being spaced every 100 feet.
Dr. Thomas A. Jagger, in charge of the Klamath volcano laboratory, who is directing the work, expects to learn something about subterranean heat in its relation to volcanic activity.
The holes will be encased around the top and capped so that temperature tests may be made at any time. It is thought that a rise in temperature in the holes may precede an eruption and thus serve as a sort of the volcano's thermometer.
Experimental holes previously drilled disclosed a wide variation in temperature, seemingly without reference to the proximity of the Klamath volcano. This convinced scientists that systematic temperature observations would be valuable.

BUILDING GREAT AQUEDUCT

ATHENS, July 1.—Over the same route taken by the famous Marathon runner when he hastened to inform the Athenians of the Hellespont victory over the Persian hordes, American engineers now are building a great aqueduct to supply the ever-growing population of Athens and Piraeus with water.
The new system, costing \$10,000,000, replaces the antiquated Herdian aqueduct, built by the famous emperor of that name 119 years after the death of Christ.

LOWEST WATER IN YEARS RESULTING IN CROP DECLINE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
SALEM, Ore., July 1.—A short second crop on many eastern and southern Oregon irrigation projects due to a water shortage is a certainty. The shortage has reached such an acute stage that State Engineer Luper was besieged by telephone calls from eastern Oregon unit midnight, asking that something be done to relieve the situation. About all that can be done, he said today, is to hold all users strictly to their rights and prevent waste.
The only projects that have water, said Luper today, are those that have good storage, such as Tullahoma, Hermiston, Warm Springs and Klamath. The Talent project in Jackson county will have water till about August 1.
In central Oregon there is sufficient water for all projects except Crook county district No. 1, a new district, and for this project the state is attempting to get an adjustment on the Deschutes that will save the projects crops this year by enforcing strictly the adjudication decree on the river, which allows each user three acre feet, and by stopping all waste.
Because of low water, crops will be short on Powder and Burnt Rivers in Baker county. Wallawa county has some shortage, but not serious. The Wallawa Lake storage has practically all been used. All streams in eastern Oregon are abnormally low, and the lowest water in the history of Oregon stream records is expected this year. Lack of precipitation for several seasons is the cause.

WOULD-BE SLAYERS OF KING ALFONSO TAKEN IN FRANCE

PARIS, July 1.—What apparently was a well developed plot to assassinate King Alfonso of Spain during his visit to France, has been uncovered by the arrest of two members of a band of five. The men are said by The Matin to have confessed that they purchased an automobile in which to meet the train on which Alfonso and Queen Victoria were traveling and do the king to death at the last stop the train made before it reached Paris. If the effort to kill the monarch failed there, it was the purpose of the conspirators to slay him during his walk in Paris. The prisoners had ample funds, three carbines and plenty of cartridges.
The men held are Spaniards, both notorious anarchists.
One of them, Abadín Francés Acosta, is declared to have confessed that he assassinated Cardinal Soldevilla Y. Romero, archbishop of Saragossa, Spain, in June 1922. He attempted to fire upon the police when he was arrested, but was overpowered.

ECHO BANK ROBBER GETS OUT OF OIL AND GETS IN JAIL

PENDLETON, Ore., July 1.—Jim Mayes, confessed bank robber, who held up the cashier of the Echo Bank yesterday at noon and secured nearly \$1500, was caught last night when he returned to the scene of his crime to get oil for his car. Immediately after the holdup Mayes jumped into his car and headed for the sand dunes toward Cold Springs. After changing his clothing and the license plates on the car, he headed back toward Echo, where he was taken. He had the money and his gun in a false bottom in the car.

PORTLAND VOTING ON VITAL FINANCE PLAN

PORTLAND, Ore., July 1.—Citizens of Portland are going to the polls today to cast votes determining upon a financial plan providing for continuation of the city's present operating facilities. The measure calls for a continuation of the revenues that have been granted by the people since 1918 and provides a basis by which in 15 years the city may be placed on a cash basis and special levies to meet operating expenses of the city will not be necessary.

RAILWAY ASKS PERMIT FOR KAMATH OVERHEAD

SALEM, Ore., July 1.—The Central Pacific railway company and the City of Klamath Falls have petitioned the Federal Reserve Commission for authority to construct an overhead crossing at six-inches, Klamath Falls, over the Central Pacific tracks. The city recently at a special election authorized a bond issue up to \$62,000 to pay the city's half of the cost.
