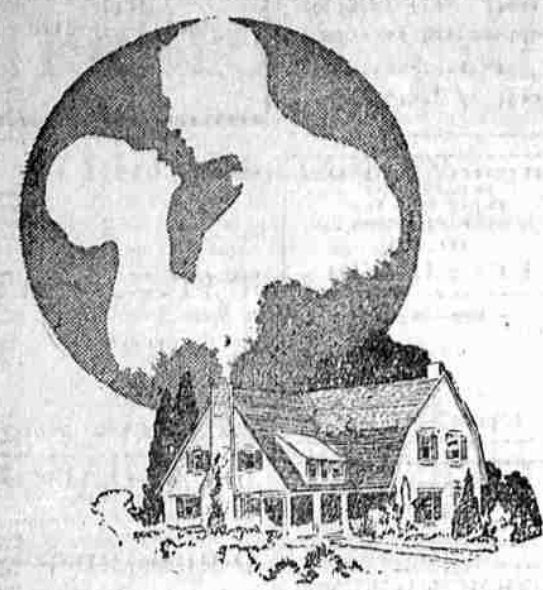

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PENSIONER'S WIVES WEAR SILENT GARTERS; TAXPAYERS PROTEST

SALEM, Ore., July 8. — Wives of sick and physically incapacitated Spanish American war veterans, who receive financial aid from Marion county, in some instances either use too much face powder, or have earrings, the glimpses of which indicate a silken texture, and for that reason some tax payers have complained to the county court that perhaps the aid given these ex-soldiers by the county is too high.

In addition, the taxpayers charge that the recent rise in pension from the government to the veterans of the Spanish war from \$50 to \$50 a month, should have a bearing on the amount paid by the county and that the county fund should be reduced accordingly.

CO-INDICTEE WITH DAUGHERTY ENTERS NOT GUILTY PLEA

NEW YORK, July 8. — Thomas W. Miller, former alien property custodian, pleaded not guilty today to an indictment charging him, Harry M. Daugherty, former attorney-general, and the late John T. King with conspiracy to defraud the government.

The indictment to which Miller pleaded not guilty involved release by the custodian of about \$7,000,000 of sequestered assets of the American Metal company, representing the sale of enemy interests in the concern, to alleged Swiss owners.

Mr. Daugherty pleaded not guilty to the indictment May 20.

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PLANS TO FORM UNION HIGH DIST. ARE DISCUSSED

County Court Hears Arguments Over Petition to Create Unit for Maintenance of School.

The county court today listened to heated arguments regarding the proposed creation of a union high school district including the Looking Glass, Happy Valley and Flournoy Valley communities.

Some time ago petitions were circulated asking the county court to hold a hearing on the proposal to create a union high school district. The law provides that where ten remonstrances are filed to the petition that an election must be called.

Following the filing of the original petition, a second petition was filed objecting to the hearing and the election and the district in general. This second petition carried some of the same names as the first.

At the hearing today several of these double signers claimed that it was their desire to withdraw from the first petition. The legal objection was raised, however, that names could not be withdrawn from a petition after action had been taken upon it. The law provides that a signer may withdraw before any action is secured upon a petition, but in this instance one side claimed action was obtained when the petition was filed, while the other side maintained that there was no action until the election was called.

In the event the withdrawals are allowed the petition, it is claimed, is not sufficient, consequently the matter hinges upon a legal opinion in this regard. District Attorney Gordon states that the law regarding union districts is so loosely drawn that he is unable to give a decision in the matter and is writing the attorney general for a formal opinion from that office.

Both sides were represented by attorneys, E. L. Eddy and A. N. O'Connell appearing on behalf of the respective groups.

The matter was thoroughly discussed before the court, some of the arguments being quite heated. Nothing will be done, however, until the attorney general's opinion is obtained.
