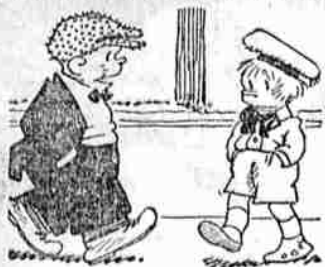

EUGENE, Ore., July 9. — Microscopic research is prolonging the life of man, and he may yet attain the three score and ten years promised in the scriptures, according to Dr. William J. Mayo, co-founder of the Mayo Institute at Rochester, Minn., who was the guest of the Lane County Medical society at a dinner given here last evening. Since the use of the microscope, the average life of an individual has been extended from 42 to 58 years, Dr. Mayo said. Cancer, the one great question before the medical world now, he said.

BOSTON, July 9. — The Commercial Bulletin will say tomorrow: While trading in wool this past week has been only moderate, there has been a fair volume of wool sold and prices have remained fully firm, despite the unsettling factors of strikes both in this country and abroad, the opening of lightweight lines for next season at unexpectedly low prices and the imminence of the London colonial auction, next Tuesday. Activity in the West has narrowed largely, owing to the fact that the clip is getting well cleared from first hands, especially west of the Mississippi river.

The opening of lightweight lines by the American Woolen company at a ten per cent reduction in prices on the average over a year ago was the outstanding development of the week and while the prices are lower than expected, the fact that prices are guaranteed against further reduction should be a stabilizing influence of great value.

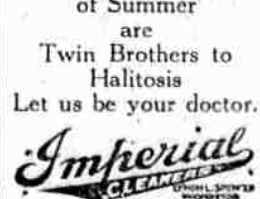
