SETTING THE HAIR

Mrs. C. C.—"Some time ago another reader asked for the following, which a friend has given me: 'Directions for a crocheted Straw Hat—Chain four, join, one single crocheted in ring. Round Two: Two single crochets in each stitch. Round Three: One single crocheted in first stitch, two single crochets in next, repeat from round. Round Four: One single crocheted in each of first two stitches, two single crochets in next; repeat from round, thus increasing in every third stitch. Round Five: Increase in every fourth stitch. Increase in this way till there are 56 stitches around. They work plain for two rounds. Or finish as suits your fancy, making more of a brim if desired. I have made one of these hats myself for sports wear, in tan color, but do not know what to wear with it. Can you advise me?'"

Diet and Health

THE GREY HAIR PROBLEM

"I was grey early in life and started to use a certain hair dye. My nerves which used to be in the best of condition suddenly became very bad and I had twitching of the muscles of the face and weak wrists. I discontinued the use of the hair dye two years ago, and have been alright ever since. I passed a life insurance examination 100 per cent. However, I don't like to be grey. What can I do?"

According to the skin specialists, the only hair dyes that are harmless are the vegetable dyes, such as walnut and henna. Other dyes may contain lead and other poisonous products, and many cases of poisoning from these have been reported, and in several instances companies selling such dyes have been fined. The Federal or State regulations, however, they will probably be continued to be sold, for there is an economic aspect as well as a personal one, to be considered.

One thing is sure: grey hair is much more stylish than it used to be, and it is not loathed, as it once was, as an indication of age. The tendency to early grayness is apparently inherited. There is no doubt that scalps that are not properly cared for are more apt to develop baldness and greyness. Proper care of the scalp means vigorous brushing three to five minutes during the day.

PRUNE GROWERS TO HOLD WAGE MEETING SATURDAY Douglas County prune growers are now becoming much interested in the scale of wages to be paid for harvesting labor, according to County Agent Cooney. Prune growers have always paid good wages for labor, states Mr. Cooney, but there exists reasons when growers are hard put to pay the usual rate. This year seems to be a season in point. Cooney states that growers are absolutely correct in their belief that any wide spread of wages paid in the various prune growing sections creates much dissatisfaction and misunderstandings between employer and employees. A meeting of growers has been called for the analysis of this situation and to agree upon a uniform scale of wages for each kind of work performed during the harvest season. This meeting will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock, July 17th at the City Hall in Roseburg.
