be well spent, but that in spite of these propositions it will be the policy of the court to devote the fund to the reducing of the county's obligations as far as possible. Although much benefit might result, it was said, from building a road up Smith River, or from completing the Miller-Trail cut-off, or from finishing the North Umpqua road, yet the court does not propose to distribute the money to these projects or to any sections of the county whatsoever.

It is in the present plan to use a portion of the money to add to the present court house fund and build a suitable court house and then to apply the balance to the creating of a sinking fund to pay off warrant indebtedness. This action will result in a general tax reduction, which will benefit every part of the county in equal proportion, and will doubtless serve to attract many new settlers who are now discouraged by the excessive tax burden.

The Port of Umpqua Commissioners agreed with the county court that the application of the fund to the reduction of taxes through paying off indebtedness would be the most equitable policy, and returned to Roosevelt last night well pleased with the results of the conference and the prospect for a sufficient amount of money to carry out plans for minor development in the Umpqua harbor.

BAKER COUNTY WOOL SELLS AT 32 CENTS

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

PORTLAND, Ore., July 21.—Sale of two clips of wool in the Baker section, aggregating approximately 225,000 pounds, at the 32 cent level, has boosted the market level in eastern Oregon.

The higher market is due to the fact that practically all of the choice wools in Oregon have now passed out of the growers' hands. About 200,000 pounds of wool, including some 1925 clips, is all that remains in the country.

ingly it is the "open season" for Americans. A bus filled with Americans visiting the fields of Montmore was surrounded by a mob, the members of which tried to dare the Americans out of it. There was a lively mixup, until the police arrived and dispersed the crowd.

Going to the excitement over the fall in the value of the franc the government has prohibited broadcasting of the rate on the dollar and pound sterling. It also is considering the question of preventing the rate being posted in places visible from the street. During the closing hours of the bourse yesterday extra police were called to hold back the great throng of people to buy foreign issues with dividends payable in stable currency and to sell domestic securities on which they feared a capital levy was to be made.

Franc Rises Slightly. PARIS, July 21.—The French franc reacted favorably today, closing officially at 66.95 to the dollar, as against 66.22 yesterday. The reason given in financial circles is that the bear movement has come far beyond the point justified by actual circumstances, and that a recovery from the violent fluctuations is certain. They assert that there is nothing behind the present downward movement but political apprehension supported by speculation. Prospects of a national union cabinet to succeed the Herriot ministry at an early date have also had an influence.

PORTLAND, Ore., July 21.—Senator Robert N. Stanford, Oregon, risked his life in a successful effort to save a drowning woman in a heavy undertow late yesterday off Ocean City, Md. Hearing Mrs. J. K. AUTO LICENSE PLATES ON CAR USED BY GUNMEN SAME AS THOSE ON LOCAL CAR

A Hudson car used in the Chinese tong battle in Seattle bore an Oregon license number corresponding to that carried on a Ford car owned by Hayden Grimm of Roseburg, according to a message received by Chief of Police Keith, who was asked to check up on the license. A Chinese resident of Seattle was killed by tong gunmen who drove up and fired a fusillade of shots at their victim and then dashed away. The license number was obtained and traced to the Roseburg car. The chief of police found that the numbers given corresponded perfectly with those of the local machine, but Mr. Grimm had both license plates and states that none had ever been stolen. Either the plates used on the Seattle car were counterfeit or a mistake was made in copying them, officials believe.
