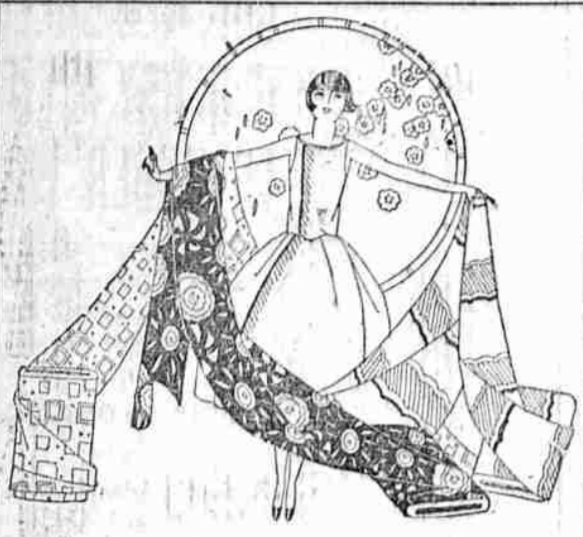

SKEET IS NEW SPORT TO TRAP SHOOTING FANS

By PETER P. GARNEY Sportmen of the United States and Canada are most enthusiastic over a new form of practice sport for shotgun shooters. The new game is called "skeet," the word being a very old form of "shoot." Groups of sportsmen, clubs, and associations are adopting this new recreation in many localities as it fills a need that has long been felt by the shotgun fraternity.

"Skeet" is designed to give the sportsman who owns a shotgun, primarily for hunting purposes, an opportunity to shoot the year around at targets that offer shots similar to those met with in actual bird hunting. The "skeet" program of twenty-five targets brings in a complete list of all the shots encountered in a day in the field. There are straightaways and in-comers, cross shots from the left and from the right, with all the angles between. There are doubles and compulsory snap shots.

Approximately 1,000 men are to be used in the one scene and the camp at Culp Creek will be maintained for about three days. The men will be quartered in Pullman cars. The 1,000 soldiers will remain in camp overnight until the scene is completed.

OREGON EXPORTS GREAT QUANTITY OF LOGANBERRIES

PORTLAND, July 21.—Shipping, as viewed by the traffic department of the Port of Portland commission, shows considerable activity in the outbound tonnage during the first two weeks of July. Loganberries, clearing for the United Kingdom, reached a total for the week of 57,963 cases weighing 1,554,132 pounds, with a value of \$222,623 which added to the shipments made during the previous week, makes a total of 88,695 cases, weighing 1,467 tons with a value of \$492,635. Other large shipments of canned goods including loganberries were made to the Atlantic seaboard.

NUMBER FILING TAX STATEMENTS IS CUT IN HALF

PORTLAND, Ore., July 22.—Statistics just compiled by Clyde G. Hambley, collector of internal revenue, reliably show the extent to which residents of this state were relieved from filing returns of income for the calendar year 1925, due to the provision in the 1926 revenue act substantially increasing the personal exemptions of both married and unmarried persons. These figures show a falling off of 56 per cent in the number of individual returns for 1925 as compared with the number filed for the preceding year. Returns were filed by only 28,924 individuals on 1925 incomes as compared to 65,358 individuals for the year before.

Former Resident of County Dies in Washington Mrs. Anna Stephens, wife of F. M. Stephens, a pioneer resident of this county, died at 83, in Washington, July 11, according to word received here. Mrs. Stephens was born in Oregon in 1854, the daughter of John and Amanda Douglas, who were early settlers at Grand Rapids. She survived by her husband five children, Mrs. Fred Dyer, Mrs. M. A. Wagner, Mrs. C. A. Dickerson, and James and Eugene Stephens of St. John. A brother, W. F. Boggs, the last of a large family, resides south of Roseburg, near Shady Point.

Former Resident Dead. REDMOND, Ore., July 21.—Dr. C. A. Cline died at 126, home of his daughter, Mrs. Jordan, in Grand Rapids, Idaho. Dr. Cline was born in Porterville, Oregon, August 28, 1850. In 1882 the family came to Oregon, settling near Roseburg. In 1884 Dr. Cline came first to central Oregon, but later returned to the Willamette valley. He came to this part of the state in 1885, taking up a claim at the falls of the Deschutes, which now bear his name. The homestead was near the site of the present bridge, where there was at that time only an Indian ford. The house was built in 1885, and given the name of Cline house. In 1877, Dr. Cline married Nellie Aldrich, and in 1885 was married the second time to Emily Marchbank.
