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FORMER ROSEBURG MUSICIANS MEET AFTER 20 YEARS

Something like twenty-five years ago George Langenberg, Louis E. Belfile and W. F. (Billy) Benjamin, all well known former residents of Roseburg, comprised the "corner" section of what was then known as the Knights of Pythias band. Eventually the three men moved to different cities on the coast. Today all three are again in Roseburg and neither knew beforehand that the others were to be here. In fact, they had practically no thought of each other's existence. Chance thus brought the three men together once more after a lapse of nearly twenty years.

The joint visit of the trio was brief owing to pre-arranged vacation plans of Mr. Belfile, who will resume his northward automobile journey tomorrow. He is now connected with the circulation department of the San Francisco Bulletin. Accompanying him on his trip are Mrs. Belfile, his daughter, Mrs. Harriet Kramer and Mrs. Kramer's two daughters, Lillian and Alice. The Kramers are residents of Grants Pass, Mr. Kramer being clerk of the New Oxford hotel in that city. Mr. Belfile's late father, a pioneer jeweler of Roseburg, was the organizer of the old Yankee Doodle band in Roseburg.

Mr. Langenberg, who is also a resident of California, has been in Roseburg for several days on his annual vacation. His father, like the elder Belfile, was an early musician of this city. Doctor Benjamin, as his title is now, arrived in Roseburg yesterday, accompanied by Mrs. Benjamin. They are residents of Portland, where Dr. Benjamin has practiced dentistry since leaving Roseburg a number of years ago. Mr. Benjamin's father was a pioneer newspaper man of Roseburg and at one time postmaster and editor of the "Daily" served as clerk prior to entering dental college, with Dr. Fred W. Haynes, of this city, as his classmate. The Benjamin family will spend several days here.

Of the three former fellow bandmen, Mr. Langenberg is the only one still regularly playing the organ. The "Knights of Pythias" band, in which they played together, was directed by Prof. Fred H. Appelhoff, who is now conductor of the Douglas County Concert Band.

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AIMEE DECLARES OFFICERS TRYING TO BLACKEN NAME

Aimee Semple McPherson, evangelist of Angelus Temple, and storm center of a two-month controversy over her story of kidnapping, today charged that Captain Herman Cline, chief of detectives of Los Angeles, and Joseph Ryan, deputy district attorney, were involved in a "determined effort to dig up dirt and fill and hurl it at her."
Cline and Ryan, respectively, father-in-law and son-in-law, yesterday announced at Carmel-by-the-Sea, that they had evidence and witnesses to prove that a woman resembling the evangelist and Kenneth G. O'Connell, former radio operator of Angelus Temple, had lived together in a cottage there during part of the time Mrs. McPherson was reported to have been drowned at Santa Monica.
Mrs. McPherson's statement today said in part:
"Cline and Ryan have been intensely active in their attempt to shatter not only my story of my abduction, but also my character. So far they have not gotten anywhere."
"Both are Catholics, persecutors, cutting protestant minister," the evangelist said.
The attitude of the two Los Angeles investigators changed toward her after she had employed her present attorneys instead of persons recommended by Cline.

FOUR DEFENDANTS AT PORTLAND DENY GUILT

PORTLAND, Ore., July 28.—Deputy United States Attorney McGilchrist insisted in federal court today the cases of Roy Moore, John Andrews and Anton Litzner be set for trial. Judge Wolverton set them for November 9.
The three prisoners, with several others, are charged with conspiracy to violate the prohibition laws. Moore has been able to raise \$10,000 bail but Andrews and Litzner are held in default of bond.

WREATH PLACED ON STATUE MUTILATED BY SOVIET CRANK

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

PARIS, July 28.—A delegation representing the Association of American Volunteers who fought with the French armies today placed a wreath on the statue of the French hero, the Marquis de Lafayette, which was damaged yesterday by a Soviet crank, a Russian laborer.

A card attached to the wreath expressed the regret of the volunteers for "the act of vandalism, committed by an irresponsible person."

Jarovenko, who mutilated the figures of an American soldier and a French pilot at the foot of the statue, told the police he did so as a demonstration against America, because of various grievances, ranging from the sentencing of Sacco and Vanzetti in Massachusetts to the exchange crisis.
