**HELEN WILLS IS
AGAIN BEATEN BY
ELIZABETH RYAN**

(Associated Press Special Wire.)
SEABRIGHT, Aug. 6.—Miss
Helen Wills, the national women's
tennis champion today met her
first defeat of the season on the
same courts, when she lost to
Miss Elizabeth Ryan of Califor-
nia, second ranking American
star, in the final of the Seabright
invitation tournament. The scores
were 6-1, 6-1.

It was the second successive
year that Miss Wills has met de-
feat at the hands of Miss Ryan
at the Seabright tournament. She
lost in straight sets last year to
the veteran Californian. It also
was the first set back for the na-
tional champion since she return-
ed to competition a fortnight
ago after being kept out of the
game for two months as the re-
sult of an operation for appendi-
citis in France.

Miss Wills put up a valiant
fight for the first set, but was
outplayed decisively in the second.

Alan Harrington, Stanford Uni-
versity tennis player, defeated
Curtis Wolfard, of San Francisco,
in the first semi-final match in
the Oregon state tennis champion-
ship tournament here today. The
score was 6-3, 6-1, 6-2.

vanquished Manuel Alonso of
Spain in the final round of the
men's singles of the Seabright in-
vitation tennis tournament today
by 6-4, 10-8, 6-2.

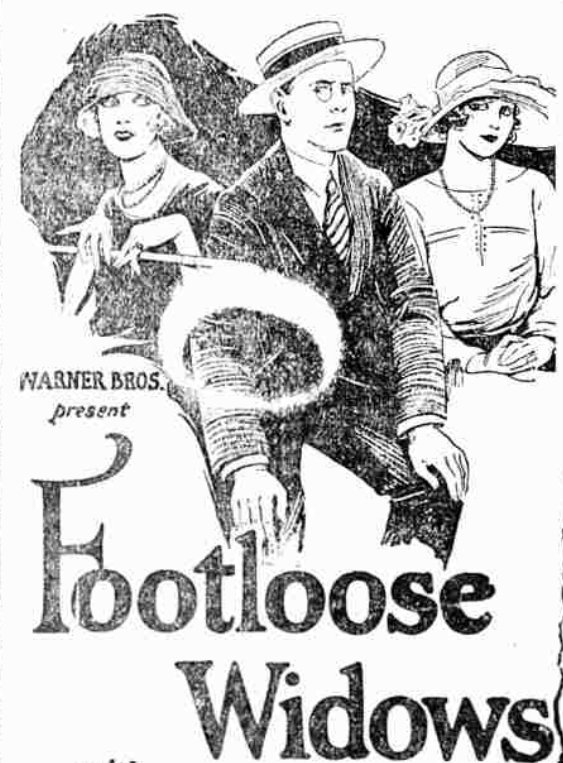

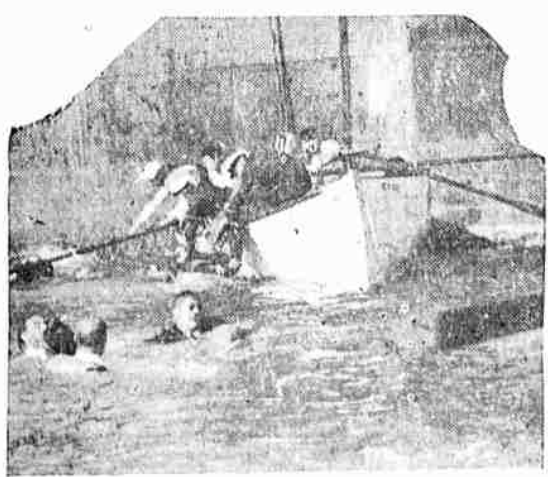
