Grants Pass Smallest City in World On Wire Circuit

(Associated Press Local News.)

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 16.—The Grants Pass Daily Courier of Grants Pass, Ore., was added to the Oregon state day leased wire circuit of The Associated Press.

The Oregon state relay of The Associated Press was established two and a half years ago. Over this circuit the members file the news of their districts and receive the news of the world, relayed through the Portland bureau, which is served by continuous double wire.

A. E. Voorhies, who has long been a member of The Associated Press, is publisher and proprietor of the Grants Pass Daily Courier. Earle E. Voorhies is managing editor.

GRANTS PASS, Ore., Aug. 16.—When the Grants Pass Daily Courier today cut in on the Oregon loop of the Associated Press leased wire, Grants Pass again laid claim to the distinction of being the smallest city in the world with leased wire news service.

Development of small farm tracts in the Grants Pass irrigation district and increased tourist trade, because of Grants Pass' strategic location at the junction of the Pacific and Redwood highways, have brought such remarkable growth in the past two years that additional wire service became imperative.
