APPEAL TO BE MADE TO VOTERS TO VISIT POLLS

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Aug. 19.—Civic associations, patriotic organizations, religious societies and clubs of business and professional men and "women are responding favorably by every mail to the appeal made by The American Legion for a nation-wide movement in support of 11,000 meetings September 21 to arrange for non-partisan committees of representatives of various organizations to get out the vote at the general election November 2, according to Frank C. Cross, National Director of the American Legion Division of The American Legion.

"Working in conjunction with the National Civic Federation, an appeal was sent to 11,000 posts of The American Legion requesting that local Legionnaires call the meetings September 11 at which representative citizens be invited to participate in awakening the duties of voters, not only to vote November 2, but to take active part in the campaign of their respective parties, and to aid in the campaign," Cross said today.

"The appeal has been heard and active cooperation promised and active cooperation promised to their members to cooperate to the fullest extent with the Legion posts. Among these organizations are the Kiwanis International, the Rotary, The D. A. R., the General Federation of Women's Clubs, the National League of Women Voters, the Chamber of Commerce of the United States, the Knights of Columbus, the Junior Chamber of Commerce of the United States, the Elks, the Grand Council of the Order of Demolay, the Military Order of the World War, the National Council of Traveling Salesmen's Association, the National Electric Light Association, the Sons of the Revolution, the United Engineering Society, the Reserve Officers' Association of the United States, and scores of others.

"We estimate that at least ten million voters have become interested through the national organizations that have taken up our appeal and placed it before their memberships, not counting the three-quarter of a million Legionnaires.

The 11,000 meetings September 21 constitute the preliminary step. They are to be attended in each instance by invited representatives of associations interested in good citizenship and civic affairs. These representatives will formulate ways and means of their own in arousing the dormant voter to do his duty as a citizen in the election November 2.
