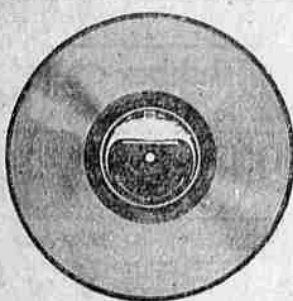

WOMEN WANTED IMMEDIATELY AT LOCAL CANNERY

The Roseburg cannery is in immediate need of women to assist in preparing fruit and berries for canning, according to a statement made today by Manager Geddes. Between fifty and seventy-five more women are wanted, and, in fact, must be secured at once unless fruit is to be allowed to spoil. In spite of efforts to secure additional labor the cannery is working short handed, it is said, and with fruit pouring in at a rapid rate, and more due to come shortly, the situation is one which is causing some concern.

The cannery is now working on pears and blackberries but will soon commence on prunes, which will be followed by apples. The plant will be in continuous operation until after the first of December, according to present indications.

3 PENALIZED FOR BOOTLEGGING; FIVE TO BE TRIED LATER

PENDLETON, Ore., Aug. 24.—Dan Downey and Emmett Graham yesterday entered pleas of not guilty to charges of possession and transportation of liquor, following their arrests Sunday evening by Sheriff R. T. Cookingham. The two are alleged with having delivered five 10-gallon kegs of liquor at a designated spot where they were arrested by the officials of the county. Downey is held in \$1,000 bond and Graham in \$1500 awaiting later trial.

T. R. Sweet, arrested in the same case, pleaded not guilty to possession and transportation and was held in \$1,000 bond. John Barnes and John Spencer, alias James Stewart, were fined \$250 when they pleaded guilty and Barnes was sentenced to 30 days in jail. Joe Perry was fined \$100 when he pleaded guilty to possession and transportation.

Two women taken in the raids were released on their own recognizance to stand trial later.

OHIO REPUBLICANS AND DEMOCRATS IN STATE ASSEMBLIES

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Aug. 24.—Republicans and democrats were here today to adopt platforms on which they will go before the voters for preference in November and to lay down the gage of battle.

Thomas J. Duffy, former member of the state industrial commission, and attorney for the Ohio Federation of Labor, is to make the keynote speech which will start the democratic campaign for the reelection of Governor Vic Donahey, former United States Senator Pomeroy to the senate, and the remainder of their ticket. The governor and Mr. Pomeroy will supplement the keynote address.

The republican keynote address will be delivered late in the day by United States Senator Simon D. Fess and his speech will be supplemented by addresses by Senator Frank B. Willis, candidate for reelection and Myers Y. Cooper, gubernatorial nominee. Adoption of the republican platform will go over until tomorrow.

CARTER OPENING TIRE BUSINESS AT SUPER STATION

W. H. (Doc) Carter, who for a number of years has been engaged in the tire repair and accessory business in Roseburg has leased the tire department at the Super Service Station on Oak Street and is opening a tire business in which he will handle a standard line of tires and tubes and will conduct a repair and service business. He has purchased complete new equipment for repair work, one of the pieces of apparatus being a sectional mold, of the latest design, which will handle repairs on all kinds of high pressure and balloon tires.

NATRON CUTOFF FREIGHT SERVICE STARTS SEPT. 1

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 24.—Freight service over the new Cascade line of the Southern Pacific between Eugene and Klamath Falls will start September 1. Local passenger service between Eugene and Klamath Falls will start September 15. This was stated today at the office of the general manager of the Southern Pacific company at Portland. Time for starting through service between Portland and San Francisco, via the Cascade line has not yet been determined.

IS THIS NEGLIGENCE?

Editor News-Review: May I call attention to an incident which was brought forcibly to my mind on the evening of Monday, August 23, and which it would seem to me constitutes a case of gross negligence on the part of someone employed by the state highway department?

On the evening mentioned I was making a short business trip to Sutherlin just after dark. Upon approaching the point where the road leading around the low land south of Sutherlin joins the highway a man stepped in the path of my car at the right of the road. Believing the ill-clad and unshaven figure to be a tramp signalling for a ride, I pulled to the left of the highway to go around whereupon he jumped to the left of the pavement. I turned to the right again and for the third time he placed himself in front of my car. I was too close to stop and could take my choice—run over him or whirl sharply into the side road. I did the latter, barely missing the man and nearly upsetting my car. As I had decided that he was either a holding man or an escaped "nut" from Salem I kept going. But later learned that he was an employee of the state highway department, guarding dangerous construction work in the dark without lantern or adequate flag.
