FOUR HORSEMEN RIDE TO MOUNTAIN PEAK IN ROCKIES ACCOMPLISHING NEW FEAT GLACIER PARK, Mont., Sept. 21.—Two Indians and two white men recently accomplished a feat of riding saddle horses to the summit of Squaw Mountain, that peak of the Rocky Mountains lying nearest to the Glacier Park Hotel and only a few miles southwest of the tourist center of the Rockies. For years parties of hikers have "made the summit" of that mountain, an elevation of 7239, over an unimproved and frequently difficult foot trail, but never before has a horse been taken over it. The horseback ascent was made by Crow Feathers and Cut Finger.

two Blackfoot Indians living near here. They were accompanied on the trip by two St. Paul young men, Ernest K. Gunn and Harlow Giesecke. The four horsemen started from the Indian village at the rear of Glacier Park hotel at 9 a. m. After a difficult trip during which the two Indians were compelled to look out notices over which the horses could find safe footing, the party reached the summit at 2 p. m. The start was made over the old foot path but after getting up toward the timber line the riders left this route and took to a slope of the mountain off the usual avenue of travel. It was necessary to cross the east slope of the mountain near the timber line, and then swing around to the south and west slopes before finding a way to the top. Realizing the importance of this accomplishment, H. A. Noble, General Manager of the Glacier Park Hotel company, has taken up with Charles J. Kraebel, superintendent of the Park, the proposition of having a horse trail laid out along the route discovered by Crow Feathers and Cut Finger. Crow Feathers announced that a view from this peak reveals the grazing ground of mountain sheep and points upon the wall of rock forming the edge of the Great Bowl.
