ROSEBURG TO PLAY COTTAGE GROVE FRIDAY

Business Houses to Close During the Time of the Game.

BIG CROWD NEEDED

School Is in Need of Moral and Financial Support of Residents of the City.

Roseburg's business activities will be suspended Friday afternoon for a couple of hours while the populace journeys out to Finlay field to watch the football team of the Roseburg high school possibly deliver a long delayed trouncing to Cottage Grove high school players. For several years Roseburg has been wallowing valiantly through a good many acres of mud, while they were used by opposing gridiron warriors as footmats. This year it is going to be a different story. Roseburg may be beaten but it will be a safe gamble that the opposing teams are going to find out they are up against something a good deal more substantial than the football teams of the past.

The Roseburg high school has slowly been developing in football participation. The last two years the school has been handicapped because of the weight of its players, but this year the team will be of average size.

Coupled with experience and knowledge gained through past participation the Roseburg players have had the benefit this year of able and efficient coaching, which has been built up from the fundamental work of last year and has added a great deal to the ability of the squad. Last year the team exhibited a fundamental knowledge of the game, but a sad lack of fighting spirit. This year they have an increased knowledge of the technical points of the game and a superb sense of fight and pep. Best of all the boys have been gradually and carefully brought up, under the expert work of Coach Turner until they are in wonderful physical trim, a goal which is of paramount importance as it not only permits the players to go the full time at top speed, but prevents or rather safeguards them in a measure from serious injury.

Roseburg has brighter football prospects than ever before and the only reason that could contribute to a season of failure would be the lack of cooperation and support on the part of the townspeople.

The team's morale can be greatly increased, the players can be given more enthusiasm and determination if they are given the wholehearted support and encouragement of the fans of the city. The team will fight to the limit if hundreds of fans are on the sidelines encouraging them, but it is decidedly dispiriting to try to battle a stubborn opposition when a few rooters are on hand to voice a desire for the team to win.

Town to Close.

The high school students have been greatly encouraged by the decision of the merchants to close up their places of business for the opening game. All of the banks, and practically all of the stores have signed a written agreement that their establishments will close at 2 o'clock and remain closed until after the game, when they will reopen to accommodate the late afternoon trade. This will permit employees to attend the contest, a most important factor in this year's athletic activities, for the high school is badly in need of a cheering squad.
