CAPITALIST SLAIN AT HIS DOOR; SON IS HELD BY POLICE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) LOS ANGELES, Oct. 21.—Police early today were holding Carl Westcott, 49, for investigation into the slaying late last night of his father, Charles Grant Westcott, 63, retire Minneapolis capitalist, as he went to answer the doorbell at his home here.

The son surrendered himself at the central police station an hour after the death of his father. He said he learned from a newspaper that his father had been slain. Grilled by the police for several hours, he stoutly maintained that he knew nothing of the murder other than that which he learned from the newspaper.

The elderly Westcott, said to have been distantly related to General U. S. Grant, leader of the union forces in the Civil War, was shot down, police report, when he went to answer the doorbell. Two shots were fired, both lodging in his head. Death was almost instantaneous.

Carl, a son by a former wife, is said by the dead man's second wife to have frequently quarreled with his father over money matters.
