WOMAN SEEKING
DIVORCE FEARS
HER HUSBAND

Court Asked for Restraining Order So That Woman May Get Personal Effects.

A suit for divorce was brought in the circuit court today by Marie Hemphill against B. E. Hemphill. Mrs. Hemphill also asks for an order of the court to restrain him from causing her bodily injury, as she fears that her action will cause him to carry out threats against her life, she says. The complaint states that they were married at Roseburg, November 9, 1925. The husband, the woman claims, mistreated and abused her and also abused her children by a former marriage. Frequent threats were made against her life, she alleges and she was also frequently threatened with bodily injury. She asks for a decree of divorce and the return of her name by her first marriage, Marie Theg. In order that she may bear the same name as her children. She also asks suit money and \$25 per month alimony. In presenting her suit she states that she fears her husband will attempt to injure or kill her, and she asks that the court issue a restraining order, so that she may be able to remove her personal effects from the house. Mrs. Hemphill is represented by Attorney Ray B. Compton.

JUDGE LEAVITT OF
KLAMATH ANSWERS
RECALL CHARGES

Cites Record in Disposal of Cases to Disprove Statements of His Accusers.

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 22.—Exercising his privilege under the recall law, Circuit Judge A. L. Leavitt of Klamath Falls, who has been subjected to a recall election set for November 2, today filed with the secretary of state a statement in justification of his service in office. "This will be certified by the clerk of Klamath county and the secretary of state to the council will be printed on the recall ballot. It follows:

"Elected for a term of six years, four of which are nearly completed, I can point with pardonable pride to the state of the record: 'The record discloses that of 1926 cases filed, 1635 have been disposed of. Of 502 cases actually tried 23 have been appealed, 3 of which have been abandoned, four of which are still pending.

"The supreme court has handed down opinions in 16 of such appealed cases, affirming me in 10 cases, and reversing me in 6. I was affirmed in one case appealed from Jackson county.

"On July 1, 1926, there were 294 cases undisposed of, 72 of which are at issue, with affidavits of prejudice filed in 8 of them. 222 out of this 294 have never been at issue and ready for trial, and have been accumulating for four years. The criminal docket is cleaned up, with the exception of indictments returned by the grand jury on September 10 and 20, 1926.

"The charge that I have made false certificates in order to draw my salary is as false as it is malicious; and is just as incapable of proof as are the other charges in the recall petition."

has on the international line. Sims lost the trail, he said, when the surface of the ground became too hard to be responsive to a person's weight.

Sims said it would have been impossible for a person to have seen the lights of either Douglas or Agua Prieta while approaching Niggerhead along the Gallardo fence from the south, where the marshal saw the tracks. Mrs. McPherson said she had seen no lights.

On cross-examination by Forest Murray, assistant prosecutor, Sims said although the territory was rough and covered with rocks, it would not scuff a woman's kid shoes.

Questioned re-directly by Gilbert, Sims said there was a "big break" in the Gallardo fence. The defense attorney apparently had in mind the statements of Mrs. McPherson that she had crossed no road in her desert walk.

Corroboration. Harold L. Henry, Douglas newspaper reporter corroborated Sims' testimony, adding that he had compared one of the shoes worn by the evangelist with the footprints along the Gallardo fence and that they tallied perfectly.

Henry said he found the woman's tracks near the Garraga or Rurales house, 23 miles from Agua Prieta and saw where an automobile had turned from the road near the house.

The tracks were visible at least 100 yards beyond the machine's tire prints.

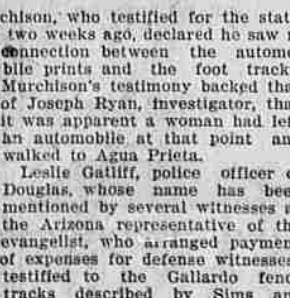
