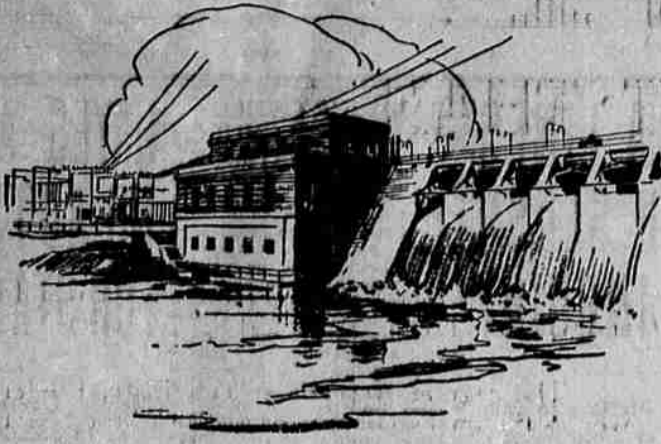

### SERVICE STATION TO RISE IN SOUTH PART OF CITY

A fine improvement is to be made soon at the intersection of Stephens and Brookway streets by A. S. Coen. Mr. Coen recently secured the property formerly owned by the Christian church and used for parsonage purposes, trading to the church a large lot, located on Kane street near Douglas, immediately adjoining the church's building site at the intersection of Kane and Douglas across from the court house. Mr. Coen is moving off the old parsonage building and is preparing to convert the lot to business purposes. A building permit has been secured for the construction of a combination store and apartment building, service station, auto repair shop, wash and greasing rack and rest room. The buildings will be of frame construction with stucco finish, the store building having two large rooms for business purposes with an apartment in the rear. The auto repair shop and wash and greasing pits will be constructed on the rear of the lot, with driveways leading in from the service station which will occupy the corner. The cost of the buildings will be in the neighborhood of \$5,000.

Although one of the oldest of the Western states, with unsurpassed natural resources and with the same class of people as her neighbor states, Oregon lags behind in the process of development. Compare with Washington. In 1880 Oregon had over twice the population of Washington. Today Washington has over twice the population of Oregon. Washington has received millions for development where Oregon has received thousands. Washington is considered doubtful; Oregon safely republican.

In the last session of Congress, both Oregon and Washington requested large appropriations for reclamation. Washington received millions, while Oregon was handed a few thousand. Washington has been assured of seven new buildings for their navy yard, aviation fields, Camp Lewis and harbors. Oregon was given her usual pittance for harbors and otherwise ignored.

Washington has the system. When they seek an appropriation, Jones (Rep.) works upon the Republican senators, while Dill (Dem.) takes care of his associates. The result is they receive enough votes from the two groups to put over their appropriations. Oregon senators are both Republican. They can't reach the Democrats.

Every western state except Oregon has a bipartisan congressional delegation or else extreme progressives like Borah and Johnson, who are far from regular. They get things, Oregon is ignored.

Haney Is Only Progressive Senatorial Candidate

FREDERICK STEIWER boasts of his regularity; pledges his support to reactionary group; supported locally by Oregon reactionaries; his pledged support commits him to vote for seating of Vane of Pennsylvania and Smith of Illinois.

ROBERT N. STANFIELD voted for the seating of Newberry of Michigan and thereby supported the buying of senatorial seats; voted against consideration of measure providing for investigation of Illinois and Pennsylvania primary scandals; voted for heavy reduction of taxes on great wealth, thereby placing a greater burden on the poorer man; voted to abolish federal tax on inheritances; voted against publicity of income tax; upheld veto of postal pay bill; stood with predatory wealth all down the line, and classified by "Labor," Washington, D. C., spokesman of organized labor, in issue of September 25, 1926, as one of "Old Guard" of reactionary politics.

### REGISTRATION IN OREGON IS 79,000 ABOVE 1924 VOTE

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 28.—The total registration of voters in Oregon for the general election of November 2 is 359,236, according to a statement made public by Secretary of State Koser.

Of the total registration the table shows 247,974 Republicans, 90,808 Democrats, 1725 prohibitionists, 2993 socialists and 12,836 of miscellaneous registration.

The vote in Oregon for presidential electors in the election of November 4, 1924, was 289,071.

### SCHOOL ELECTION

Notice of School Election to Increase Tax More Than Six Per Cent Over That of the Previous Year.

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of School District No. 4 of Douglas County, State of Oregon, that an election will be held in said District at the Junior High School on the 22nd day of November, 1926, at 2:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to vote on the question of increasing the amount of the tax levied in said district for the year 1926-27 by more than 6% over the amount of such levy for the year immediately preceding.

It is necessary to raise this additional amount by special levy for the following reasons: The operation of an additional building and the employment of eleven new teachers whose salaries amount to about \$23,000 make it necessary to ask for this increase which amounts to \$8,263.74.
