BLAME PLACED POOR POLICING IN RIOT CASE

(Continued from page 1.)

The disturbance for several days preceding the climax thereof at Canyonville should have been handled at their inception by the Canyonville authorities and the persons responsible therefor, if apprehended, prosecuted by the municipality. Local disturbances in municipalities are proper subjects to be handled by the city authorities and a proper policing at all times will save disturbances such as occurred at Canyonville.

We have examined into the condition of the county administration of justice.

We find the poor farm under efficient management. The examination of the main building at the poor farm discloses that the roof of the building is in serious need of repair; in our judgment, the building should be entirely re-roofed as a measure of economy in that a new roof will save considerable expense that will necessarily have to be incurred in caring for the balance of the building if the present dilapidated roof is retained.

We recommend further that some sort of a ventilator be placed in the roof of the building immediately above the head of the stairs to more efficiently ventilate the building.

Report on Jail

The Douglas county jail will not pass inspection as a sanitary hog pen. It is a menace to the health of its inmates and can not be depended upon to securely hold any prisoner who makes a determined effort to escape. It gives absolutely no protection to an officer who must enter the building for the purpose of bearing food or fuel to the interior and it is wholly unfit and inadequate to serve the county as a place of confinement. We make no recommendations for repair or change in the jail because it cannot be repaired in any other way than by completely new construction.

Our investigation into conduct of the county officers is necessarily slight; we have no recommendations to make as to the conduct of the various offices, no complaints having been before us and there appearing to be a proper conduct of county affairs.

There are several matters which have been brought to our attention for investigation which we have been unable to completely inquire into owing to absence of material witnesses. We, therefore, request that the court continue this grand jury over to the next term in order that we may complete these investigations.

well as in the hospital, and if your physician will write to the Lying-In Hospital, 24 Avenue and 17th Street, New York City, they will send him literature on the subject.

Meanwhile, see that you are not overeating or under-eating, and that you have a balanced diet with particular attention to getting a quart of milk daily in some form, for its calcium.
