SKIN DISEASES, PLUS. Psoriasis is one of the most difficult of skin diseases to cure permanently. The cause of the disease is not fully known. Some skin specialists believe it is due to infection, others that it is inherited and still others believe that it is a disturbance of the nervous system. Digestive disorders certainly seem to aggravate or provoke the disease, and some of those who have psoriasis are rheumatic or gouty.

BEAUTY CHATS. CARE OF TOILET THINGS.

It is surprising how many diseases of the skin and scalp are communicated from one member of a family to another through towels and face cloths and brushes and such things. You may think, carelessly, that the face cloth soaped liberally every day, or twice a day, with which you wash your face must be clean, it is being washed so often. But it isn't being washed.

Hair brushes need special care—a thorough washing once a week with hot water for both brush and comb, if you want healthy hair. And use only your own things.

Mame F.—The bluing added to henna is the same as you use for laundry purposes, and it is quite harmless, so you can add as much as is necessary to darken the henna shade to your taste; I would not advise a hair dye.

Anxious Blue Eyes—Use cucumber or lemon juice to bleach the summer tan from your skin, and after leaving this on the skin for a half hour, wash it off and massage with a cream or olive oil. It is all right for you to use soap if you rinse enough afterward.

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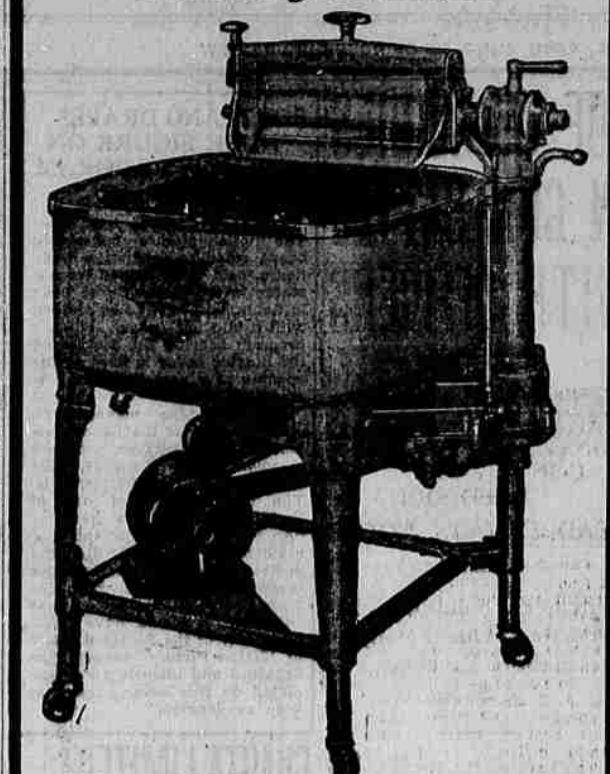
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
