Mr. McCreary states that he deeply regrets leaving Douglas County. He has been in business at Sutherlin for 7 years and has great faith in the future of Sutherlin and of the county. His duty, he feels, calls him to his aged mother, and he is leaving soon, his family having been in the east for some time. Because he will be unable to return to the West for several years, at least, he decided that it would be impossible to continue his business while away, and is so offering the entire stock at a greatly reduced price.

CHINESE PIRATES
ROB STEAMER OF
\$50,000 BULLION

Passengers Forced to Give Up \$20,000 More; Arms and Ammunition Also Seized.

(Associated Press Special Wire.)
HONGKONG, Nov. 13.—Twenty-six pirates boarded the French steamer Hanot at Kwangchowwan, south of here, shot and killed a guard, ransacked the steamer, robbed the passengers and then abandoned the ship, taking \$50,000 worth of bullion, \$20,000 in loot from the passengers and a large quantity of guns and ammunition. It was learned here today.

The Hanot, a vessel of 1200 tons, plies between Haiphong, French Indo-China, and Hongkong by way of Pakhoi, southern Kwangtung. The bulk was being shipped from the maritime customs at Pakhoi to a Hongkong bank.

After killing the guard the pirates tossed his body overboard and proceeded to loot the ship, encountering no further resistance.

Eleven rifles, ten revolvers and thousands of rounds of ammunition made up the haul in guns and cartridges. The boarders then turned the Hanot toward the bay and abandoned her.

BATAVIA, Java, Nov. 13.—There were widespread communit outbreaks overnight in various parts of western Java. Several persons were killed and a number wounded. Minor damage was done to the railway and telegraph lines. The authorities promptly quelled the disturbance.

SHANGHAI, Nov. 13.—A wireless message picked up here reports that bandits opened fire Thursday on an American vessel, a Chinese tug and a junk at Chongien, on Tung Ling Lake, southwest of Hankow. The pirates demanded ransom, but the vessel was released on Thursday night. No details were given.
