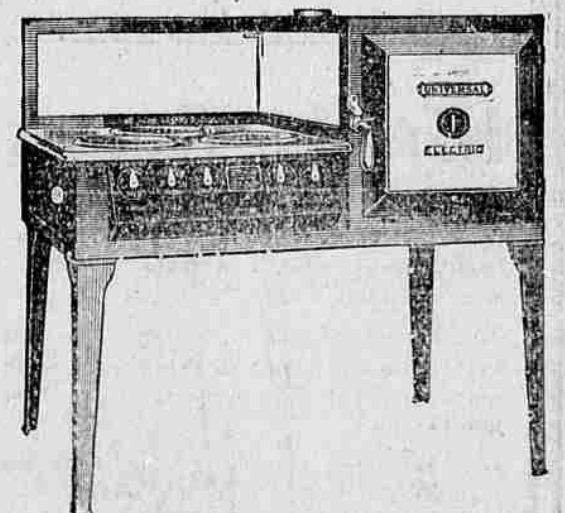

Mrs. L. Michaels, who recently moved to Corvallis, visited in this city this morning, on her way to Canyonville, where she will look after her farm interests for a few days.

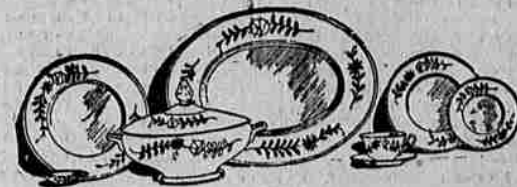
Vice-Consular Agent Here—

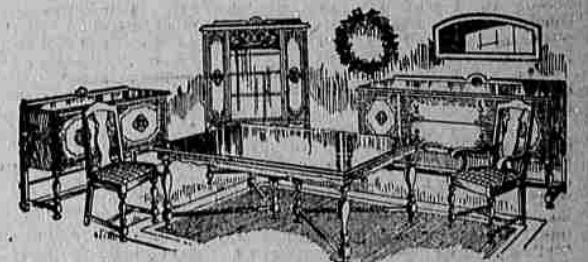
