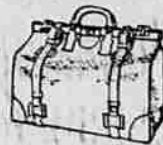

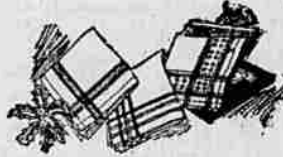

MARKETS

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 16.—Fresh egg values are slightly easier on the local market with firms down a cent at 39 cents and mediums down 2 cents at 36 cents. No change was made in extras or other grades and the top remains at 42 cents. Receipts Wednesday were 957 cases and 144 cases were pulled from the coolers. The fresh butter market is

steady and unchanged. Butterfat market is somewhat mixed with prices being paid in the country ranging all the way from 47 to 50 cents while Portland delivery prices range from 50 to 52 cents. Little improvement is shown in the demand for poultry and all classes are dragging. Twenty-four cents appears the general top for heavy hens now, with light hens fractionally higher at 18½ to 19 cents. A peculiar situation exists in the local turkey market. With country shipping points strong at 45 cents and buyers eager to pay

that price the local wholesale market is dragging at 44 cents and many of the 45 cent turkeys purchased in Douglas county and other shipping points are headed for this market.

Wheat: BBB hard white, hard white, bluestem, baart, federation, soft white \$1.34; western white \$1.34; hard winter \$1.35; northern spring \$1.32; western red \$1.30.

Approximately 700,000 pounds of the Idaho wool pool not disposed of at the sealed bid sale in Port-

land December 6, will again be put up for sale the latter part of January. The exact date will be announced in the near future.

There were originally 1,500,000 pounds in the Idaho wool pool and close to half of the clips were disposed of at the first sale. Bids on the remaining lots were not satisfactory and they were withdrawn to await a more favorable market. Since then one or two of the lots have been disposed of at private sale.
