NO NEW CASES OF SCARLET FEVER SINCE SUNDAY

No new cases of scarlet fever have been reported in the city since Sunday, according to Dr. Thompson, county health officer. All known cases are under strict quarantine, there being 10 cases in the city in all, confined to six

families. The health unit has been having considerable difficulty in securing materials for the Dick test, to determine susceptibility, will be given at the health office to all children whose parents are willing for the action to be taken.

Many parents are already greatly interested and have been having their children immunized through the family physician or the health unit.

Dr. Thompson is leaving tomorrow for Portland, and will return Monday night. During his absence Miss Natalie Markwitz, the health nurse, will serve as quarantine officer and will answer calls at the office.

RICH LABORITE VICTOR IN RACE FOR COMMONS

Oswald Mosely Triumphs Over Opposition of the Tory Press.

POSITION ANOMALOUS

Wife, Descendant of Noted American Money King, Will Be Candidate at Later Date.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) STAFFORDSHIRE, Eng., Dec. 22.—Sneathwick is still staunchly laborite, although its new representative in parliament travels about in a limousine and is married to a lady with a title.

Oswald Mosely, termed the "silver spoon socialist," because of his wealth, was returned in yesterday's by-election by a majority of 3,982 over his conservative and liberal opponents, the vote being: Mosely 16,077; J. M. Pike, conservative 9,495; W. Bayliss, liberal, 2,600.

His majority was 2,797 greater than that received in the last election by J. E. Davidson, laborite. Judging from the enthusiasm with which the result was announced, Mosely and his wife, Lady Cynthia, have won a big hold on a large section of the country. When the cheering died down the crowds sang "the red flag" and then switched to Christmas carols.

Wife Also Candidate. Mosely now returns to the House of Commons, where he first sat as a conservative in 1918 and where he was a family figure until 1924 when the labor government was ousted. Meanwhile he changed first to independent and then to Socialist-Laborite.

It seems likely that he will eventually be joined in the commons by his wife, who has already been adopted as socialist-labor candidate in stores for the next election. Lady Cynthia is a daughter of the late Lord Curzon and granddaughter of the late Lord Z. Leiter of Chicago. She took a leading part in her husband's campaign, working among the women in the tenements, urging their babies, making speeches and leading in the singing of socialist songs.

Views of Result Vary. Laborites today declared the result was a notable defeat for the "Tory press lords," whose papers daily attacked Mosely on the ground of his alleged insincerity and inconsistency in posing as a champion of socialism while enjoying the great wealth and not following any definite occupation.

Mosely issued a statement saying: "The result shows that the government has entirely lost the confidence of the country and has now no new mandate to govern." Pike, the conservative candidate said: "The electorate seems to have been hypnotized by Mosely's worldly possessions. The main lesson of the election is that the conquest of the labor party by wealthy aristocrats has begun."

LONDON.—Religion is too deep to be noisy, in the opinion of Dean Inge. He has never met a case even remotely resembling sudden conversation.

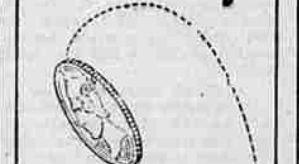
QUEBEC.—Perhaps the figures will be less next year because of the recent Ontario election. American tourists spent \$57,339,279 in the province of Quebec last summer.
