AIR IS FREE-- OIL COSTS MONEY

"Air is cheaper than oil. Yet neglect of air can be just as costly to a car user—whether passenger car or commercial vehicle, as neglect of oil." N. A. Simmler, of Roseburg Garage, distributors of General tires, thus points out a situation that is fairly common, and goes on to explain:
"Take a bus or truck for instance; the motor in that machine represents to the operator a capital investment of something like \$500 to \$600. If a driver were to take that bus or truck out and use it without plenty of good oil, he would promptly be 'fired' by the owner. Yet even if the engine 'went dry' and burned out bearings and scored cylinders, the damage could be repaired for a comparatively small sum—say \$50 to \$100, according to the amount of damage done. Anyway the engine would not be ruined. It would not be necessary to throw it away and invest \$500 to \$600 in a new one."
"A good set of tires for a bus or

truck—including spare—often represents as large a capital investment as the engine—\$500 to \$600. The driver who takes out that job without proper air pressure in the tires is just as negligent as the one who forgets to put oil in the motor—and absence of air is likely to be more costly to the owner than carelessness about oil.
"When a tire blows out as a result of being too soft—so that it flexes too extremely and cannot prevent a sharp stone from smashing it against the rim, such a tire is usually a total loss. Repairs in such cases are hazardous at best, for the fabric all the way round may be injured by heat and too much flexing. Then, too, an innocent inner tube blows out when the casing gives way, and that is lost. Strange as it may seem, few drivers are 'fired' for neglecting air, though many 'resign' quickly when it is known that they neglect oil.
"The point is that a tire runned through neglect and abuse is a total loss, and a set of tires cost as much as an engine. Yet motors are watched, listened to and tinkered constantly, while even in commercial work there is an appalling neglect of equally costly tires.
"Remember, air is free and oil costs money. There is no reason why tires in all kinds of work

should not be looked after as carefully as any other part of the mechanism that makes up a job—or a fleet of them.
"It has been proved beyond doubt that difference in tire care can mean the difference between profit and loss in the operation of a whole transportation business. The tire man cannot follow every tire he sells every mile it runs, but it is his duty to issue this sort of warning and suggestion, so that the user may get all the miles that are built into the tires at the factory."

DOLLAR BILLS ARE USED IN CODE OF LIQUOR RUNNERS

NEW YORK, Jan. 5.—Dollar bills have served as official order blanks for bootleggers on run row. Several numbers of the bills, William R. Newman, a government witness, testified at the trial of 18 members of an alleged rum ring, were deciphered into orders for Scotch, rye and gin. As an example, he told the court that the serial number K281349018B on one dollar bill called for 50 pints of Scotch but he did not explain the basis of the code. Edward Kelly and his brother, Frank, and Edward and Frank Costello, four of the indicted men, are said by the government to be the "master minds" of a great liquor running organization between Canada and the United States which had its own fleet of ships and maintained large business offices in New York.

300 PLAYERS WILL COMPETE IN GREAT GOLF TOURNAMENT

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 5.—Six noted golf courses of Los Angeles and vicinity today are the scenes of the beginning of the greatest event in the golf year for southern California, the Los Angeles \$10,000 open golf tournament. Approximately 300 players, amateur and professional, from 25 states and from England and Canada, are entered in the tournament.
Thirty-six holes of qualifying play today on the courses of the Los Angeles, Brentwood, California, Wilshire, Midwick and Hillcrest Country clubs will determine what 128 players are fortunate enough to shoot the low scores which will qualify them to start in the 72 holes of play at El Caballero country club on Friday. About forty of these 128 already are chosen, these being the foreign players and leaders in the national and local tournaments of the past year, who are exempt from qualifying play.

ANGRY STUDENTS AT WESLEYAN HISS PREXY IN CHAPEL

BUCKHANNON, W. Va., Jan. 5.—Student animosity against a recent ruling curtailing athletics at West Virginia Wesleyan college has broken out, with Dr. Homer E. Wark, president, the principal target for undergraduate criticism.
After Dr. Wark had been heard at chapel services yesterday there were rumors on the campus that

students may resort to a strike in protest against Dr. Wark's order restricting athletic activities at the college in order to provide funds for a new chair of theology. The chapel demonstration was not the only indication of undergraduate wrath against the president. Students at early morning classes reported they had seen an office of Dr. Wark hanging from a tree at the main gate of the college campus, but it was removed before a majority of the students had seen it.

JUNIOR HIGH TO PLAY ASHLAND FRIDAY NIGHT

The Roseburg Junior High school basketball team is preparing for a strenuous season, which starts Friday night with a game here with Ashland. The team recently played a game with Looking Glass, and will play a return game at Looking Glass Saturday. The Ashland game on Friday will be the first to be played against teams of other junior high schools. Games will follow with Medford, Grants Pass and Eugene at intervals. The Junior high school is represented by a fast team and despite the light weight has made a good showing. The team has played practice games several times with the senior high school, the practice against superior weight and speed being valuable.

ROW OVER THEFT OF UMBRELLA IS TRAGEDY CAUSE

DALLAS, Ore., Jan. 5.—Leo Roberts and his wife are being held under arrest here, pending a coroner's inquest into the death of John Macomber, 45, who was shot to death on the Roberts' porch last night following a quarrel over the theft of an umbrella. An inquest is to be held today.
Angered because the Roberts family had told neighbors they believed he had taken an umbrella from their porch, Macomber went to their house last night for an explanation. In the course of an argument, Roberts and Macomber came to blows. Mrs. Roberts, seeing her husband was getting the worst of the battle, ran to a back room and returned with a rifle. In the meantime Roberts had pushed Macomber from the house, and as the latter turned, snatched the rifle from his wife's hands and fired. The bullet caused Macomber's death ten minutes later.
