MAJ. FRANK EBBERT TO GIVE LECTURE ON PROHIBITION

Major Ebbert knows the law and the facts on prohibition. He can tell what he knows concisely, attractively and eloquently. For nearly a decade he has been one of the outstanding leaders in the fight for a dry nation. He has won for himself the distinction of being one of the foremost dry lawyers of America. He was general counsel and legislative director of the Illinois anti-saloon league for eight years. Because of his splendid record he was chosen associate general counsel with headquarters in Washington, D. C., for the national anti-saloon league.

Major Ebbert is a veteran of the World war and also a veteran of the Spanish-American war. For several years he was professor of the law of contracts in one of the great law schools of the country. RAFFETY WANTS NO CUDDLING STUFF IN AUTOMOBILE DRIVES

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 8.—Suggestions to the legislature framed by the Oregon Automobile conference here include a law against a driver holding an arm around another person, or having one on the lap while driving a car. This is one of the recommendations of T. A. Raffety, chief of the state traffic policemen.

Windshield stickers, except those required by law, would be banned, and truck drivers would be required to come to a full stop while making deliveries.

The Hoover uniform vehicle code was approved with some variations. Changes in the light law and the title law were to be considered this afternoon.

TOP OF MT. HOOD LAST EFFORT IN BROWNLEE HUNT

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 8.—Three veteran mountaineers early today set out from Battle Axe Inn at Government Camp to climb to summit cabin, highest point on Mt. Hood, in the hope that Leslie Brownlee might be located at the cabin.

Brownlee became separated from a companion last Saturday at the east side of Tynagle Moraine, and for a week all accessible places on the south side of Mt. Hood in the neighborhood of Tynagle Moraine have been combed by searchers without avail.

On the bare possibility that Brownlee, who was an experienced climber, might have made his way to the summit cabin for refuge, the three men decided to make a final effort today. Liege Coleman, Mark Weygandt and Bill Long started out for this last attempt.

Last night 27 other searchers gave up the quest and today they were returning to their homes. Mr. and Mrs. Brownlee, parents of the lost youth, remained at Battle Ax Inn today hoping against hope that their boy might yet be found.

**WILLIE HOPPE IS
AGAIN THE WORLD
BILLIARD KING**

NEW YORK, Jan. 8.—The familiar figure of Willie Hoppe held forth at the top of the 18-ball, blue billiard world again today in the glory of a remarkable triumph.

Toppled from the pinnacle two years ago by Jake Schaffer of Chicago, the 39-year-old veteran came back with a brilliant finish to pull the mantle from the shoulders of Eric Hagelbacher, defending title holder, in a heart-breaking final block sprint, 1500 to 1387. The match ended early today after three night play.

For five hours the two players gave a masterful exhibition. It was not a battle for spectacular stroking. But for sensational runs and high break averages, the match never had been equalled here. Hagelbacher fought to overcome the challenger's 150 point second block lead and Hoppe battled to hold on. Hoppe regained a crown he had previously held over an almost unbroken stretch of 17 years. Schaffer, who dethroned him two years ago, lost and won back the title in the matches with Edmond Horemans, of Belgium, before finally succumbing to Hagelbacher less than a year ago.
