

POISON TAKES 3 IN FAMILY; TWO OTHERS ARE ILL

TITACBY, Calif., Jan. 20.—Mrs. Mary Hannon and two of her children, Rose, 5, and William, 13 months, are dead today and two other Hannon children are in a local hospital seriously ill from the effects of poison said to have been given the children by their mother. Manuel Hannon, the husband, returned to his home last night to find his wife and two children dead, and the two other, Mary 4, and Joseph, 3, writhing in pain. Authorities are of the opinion that Mrs. Hannon gave the children their poison with their evening meal. Hannon could give no motive for the act.

PHILADELPHIA IS STILL TRYING TO PAY SESQUI DEBT

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 20.—The Sesqui-centennial Exposition closed officially December 31, is still costing the tax payers of Philadelphia about \$30,000 weekly. Consistent with his home, where he is ill, after a day of employees had waited all day in the exposition administration building for their pay, two days overdue, E. L. Austin, the director, revealed that the exposition association maintains a staff of 60 clerks, 200 laborers and eight executives. A staff of auditors is costing about \$3,000 a day, Austin said. Employees whose wages are overdue will be paid from a \$200,000 bank balance, the director added. Fear had been expressed by some of the employees that the bank balance had been attached by creditors whose \$5,000,000 claims have been held up by the city comptroller.

NORTHERN LINES MERGER TO KEEP WITHIN DECREE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
NEW YORK, Jan. 20.—Developments by a joint statement by officials of the two companies, seem to have quashed definitely recent reports that the proposed huge northwestern railway merger would resemble in form, the plan started 25 years ago and declared illegal by the government. The new plans definitely do not contemplate, it was announced, the establishment of a "mere holding company."

This fact makes whatever proposition is accepted for the merger necessarily different from the Northern Securities company, incorporated November 13, 1901 in New Jersey to act as a holding company for the stocks of the Northern Pacific railway and Great Northern railway companies. That company, formed to invest in and hold securities of other corporations, was declared in March, 1904 by the United States supreme court to be a combination in violation of the anti-trust act, and on April 21, 1904, stockholders voted to reduce the stock and distribute the securities. It is understood officials of the Great Northern and of the Northern Pacific, in their discussion today will center attention on a plan, general details of which were announced Tuesday. That plan contemplates the formation of a new company which will not only control through stock ownership, but will involve leasing of the lines to a single operating carrier, which also will directly operate the Spokane, Portland and Seattle Railway company. The Chicago, Burlington and Quincy, 97 per cent of the stock of which is already jointly controlled by the two northern roads, will probably remain separate as at present.
