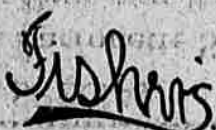

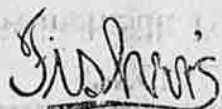

DAYS CREEK MAN TRADES RANCH FOR BUSINESS HOUSE

B. J. Pinckney of Days Creek and A. T. Lawrence, local real estate dealer, drove to Eugene yesterday where they were met by Mr. Walter R. Alvin and drew the final papers in a transaction whereby Mr. Pinckney becomes the owner of a large steel and concrete building in Portland. The purchase price of this building, which is a large two-story structure, with 8 stores and 8 apartments, was \$50,000. The building is located on Foster Road in Woodmere and is in an excellent location. Mr. Pinckney applied his fine farm at Days Creek as part payment and the balance was cash. Mr. and Mrs. Pinckney are leaving for Portland soon to take over the management of their new holdings. The Days Creek people will greatly regret their departure as they have been very active in the life of the community where they have been making their home for several years. Mr. Pinckney found it necessary to dispose of the farm, however, as it required too much of his time, which he will now be freer to devote to his property interests at Coos Bay and to his restaurant at Canyonville. The deal was handled by A. T. Lawrence of Roseburg and W. R. Alvin of Lebanon. The Pinckney ranch has been taken over by Mr. G. E. Fox of Salem. It is understood that Mr. Fox has a tenant for the place. Another carload of American zinc insulated fence will arrive soon at Wharton Bros.
