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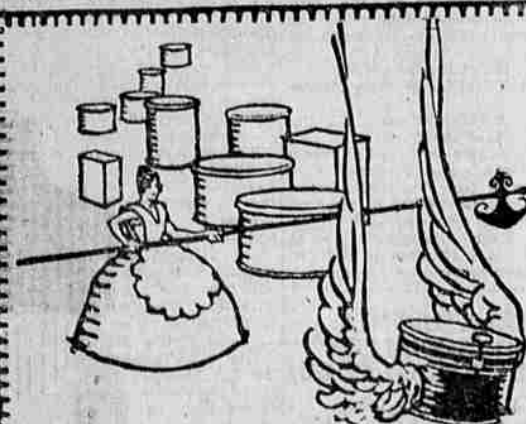

Governor has signed house bill 55—enlarging range for livestock in Douglas county.

Senate O. K. Song.
"Oregon, My Oregon," is adopted as the state song by senate joint resolution number 3, which was passed by the senate today.

The resolution must yet pass the house. It is recommended by the schools and patriotic societies. The author of the song is J. A. Buchanan, an attorney of Astoria, formerly located at Roseburg for many years.

The Indian, or whoever may indulge in a game called "Indian sticks" may continue to play without being a lawbreaker, because the house today indefinitely postponed house bill 26, introduced by Representative Joseph M. Scott of Pendleton. The bill would have classified "Indian stick" with other gambling games and provided a penalty for operators of the same.

The house also rocked to sleep house bill 92, which would have levied a tax of five per cent on the gross receipts of express companies in Oregon.

Tax Bills Withdrawn.
Representative Albert S. Roberts of Wasco county withdrew house bill 213 which would have provided a general luxury tax. Representative A. E. Allen, took similar action with his bill 252, which would have provided for a heavy system of license tax on theaters and other amusement places. The
