An over-abundance of war lords brought on the present crisis in China.
Nominally a republic—proclaimed so when the Manchian emperors were cut off the country's payroll 11 years ago—China in fact is a crazy quilt of warring military powers.
Hopes of democratic rule inspired the overthrow of the emperors. But "war lords" stepped in where the Manchian despots left off, and snuffed these hopes in the bud.
Since then China has been a welter of political disorder, banditry, and military aggression by this

ambitious dictator and that.
But the blame cannot be placed entirely on the Chinese war lords. Foreign exploitation, through the various concessions, has kept the war smoldering until it now threatens to burst into a flame equaling the Boxer rebellion.
The Chinese war lords are politicians and, with some justification because of exploitation in the past, they have made hatred of foreigners their battle-cry. That rarely fails to rally the Chinese to the various armies.
Two Groups Now Foremost
Two main groups of military leadership now are contending in

China. They are:
Marshal Chang Tso-lin, ruler of north China, and his followers.
The Cantonese or "Nationalists", comprising followers of the youthful Chang Kai-shek in south China, and the Yangtze river valley and Feng Yu-hsiang in the Chinese northwest.
Popular opinion among Chinese heavily favors the Cantonese faction. European nations, seeking first of all to preserve their investments in China, are said to support the rival Chang Tso-lin or Peking government.
Division of Chinese sentiment and military control extends considerably beyond the south China-north China split, however.
In some of the Chinese provinces no war lord has succeeded in establishing himself. At least two, Yunnan and Shensi, the authority of local governors has been preserved.

Tibet and Mongolia are dependencies of China in theory. In fact, Tibet is independent and Mongolia is subject to Russian influence.
Dozens of other war lords have risen and fallen since China first forsake the Manchian monarchy. One of these was Wu Peifu, who fought with Chang Tso-lin in 1920, against him in 1922-23, and with him again in 1925. Wu Peifu now is in virtual retirement.

Up Today, Down Tomorrow
Sun Chuan-fang, arose from governor of Chekiang to military control of this and four other provinces. He proclaimed their independence. Now the Cantonese, invading the Yangtze valley, have reduced his territory to the one province of Kiangsu, in which the city of Shanghai is located. Sun Chuan-fang is an ally of Chang Tso-lin.
Feng Yu-hsiang, once was a corporal. He won the friendship of Wu Peifu and came to dominate the Peking government. Later he withdrew to the northwestern provinces he now rules.

The Master of the North
Chang Tso-lin, rugged master of north China, started out in Chinese public life as a bandit chief, fought for Japan in the Russo-Japanese war, and after the Chinese republic was proclaimed, achieved supreme power in Manchuria.
The Cantonese or "Nationalist" movement has been accompanied by China's nearest approach to the formation of a political party called the "Kuomintang."
This party is the outgrowth of the patriotism of Sun Yat-sen, who commented the overthrow of the Manchians. Its political program calls for unification of China territorially and modernizing of its governmental institutions, along with the abolition of all treaties not based on the equality of both contracting parties.
This last provision, affecting "extraterritoriality," and foreign control of customs duties, is of vital concern to the great western

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MEXICAN REVOLT LEADERS GIVEN USUAL PENALTY

MEXICO CITY, Feb. 5.—On instructions from President Calles to inflict drastic punishment if they were found guilty of conspiring against the government, Julio Arriola, former governor Oaxaca, and Nino Rivera, an ex-army major were executed at Puebla City after a rapid court-martial.
The two men, leaders of an anti-government plot, were captured with six of their followers at a meeting at midnight Thursday. At daybreak Friday Arriola and Rivera were put to death, having confessed before the court martial. It is stated.
The others arrested also will be tried by court martial and it is reported that at least two of them will be executed. Files discovered by the police in the conspirators' meeting place are said to have disclosed various military appointments signed "Fernando Gonzales" chief of staff under Porfirio Diaz. Gonzales, according to the police, claims the title of "supreme chief-tain of the revolution."

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WEATHER DURING JANUARY NEAR NORMAL MARK

The weather for the month of January was very near the normal according to the monthly report made by Arthur W. Pugh, meteorologist in charge of the local weather bureau station. In temperature the month was slightly above the average, while the rainfall was also somewhat above the normal figure, but in neither case was the difference sufficient to be counted unusual.
The highest temperature recorded during the month was 65 degrees, while the lowest was 18 degrees. The warmest ever recorded during the month of January since the establishment of the office was 71 degrees and the lowest on record, six below. During the month just past the average daily temperature was 42.8 degrees, the normal being 41.2 degrees.
In precipitation the total rainfall was 6.01 inches, while the normal for the month is 5.70 inches. There is now an accumulated excess of rainfall of 2.59 inches since the beginning of the wet season, which dates from September first.
The hardest wind recorded during the month reached a velocity of 24 miles per hour, while the average hourly velocity throughout the month was 2.9 miles per hour. There were 2 perfectly clear days, 7 partly cloudy and 22 cloudy. There was rainfall recorded in 19 days during the month.

MAYOR AND THREE OFFICERS FACING TERMS IN PRISON

NEW YORK, Feb. 5.—The mayor of a New Jersey town, his chief of police and two of the town's detectives today face penitentiary sentences for their part in the \$2,000,000 rum running conspiracy of the steamship Elker.
Fourteen persons, including Mayor Henry Wiswell, of Edgewater last night were found guilty by a federal court of conspiracy to dispose of smuggled merchandise.
Wiswell, his police chief and detectives who were charged with accepting \$43,000 in bribes to insure landing of the liquor in Edgewater will be sentenced Wednesday. The maximum penalty is two years in the Atlanta penitentiary and \$10,000 fine. The other convicted conspirators were sentenced last night, the heaviest punishment given any one being a year and a day at Atlanta.
Four others, who had pleaded guilty, likewise face maximum penalties of two years and \$10,000 fines.

DOC COOK ADVISES RACE OF PYGMIES FOR LIGHT WORK

LEAVENWORTH, Kansas, Feb. 4.—Development of a race of pygmies to do the world's lightest work is advocated by Dr. Frederick A. Cook, Arctic explorer serving a sentence in the federal prison here on a charge of fraud with oil transactions.
In an article appearing in the New Era, prison publication, Dr. Cook suggests bringing large numbers of pygmies from tropical countries to the Virgin islands for development and training as servants.
Dr. Cook said he conceived this plan in considering the problems growing out of a declining birth rate among highly civilized races, which he feared would result in a shortage of labor in many lines. The pygmies, he believes, could be employed in offices, factories, homes for positions where little hard labor is required.

accident—Mrs. A.
This is the first time I have had a report of plumes after reducing. Usually it is the reverse. I am inclined to think that you may be overeating some food that disagrees with you, or that you are not following our instructions carefully and getting a balanced diet—with the exception of the leavened fats and starches. Are you taking bran? Some people have an idiosyncrasy to bran and will have a little breaking out of the skin from it.
It might be well anyway, Mrs. A., to take a rest from reducing for two or three weeks, after such a good loss, and start in again then. Are your bowels regular? Drinking plenty of water? Sunlight and exercise? (We have an article on Constipation which may help you. See directions to Mrs. A. for obtaining it.)
It might be well for you to go on a maintenance diet—that is, one that keeps you at a steady weight—for six days in the week, and one day go on a very low liquid diet day—100 to 600 calories, and reduce in that way.
