Mich., an ex-convict, was shot down last night by a policeman, a few minutes after he is alleged to have brutally assaulted William Trustman, a newsboy. Ballard, who leaped on the boy as he passed an alley enroute home and battered him with a sawed off baseball bat, until interrupted by the approach of a passerby. The boy's leg was broken by a blow from the club, and he was so severely injured that recovery is not expected.

The passerby, attracted by the lad's groans, summoned police who immediately circled the neighborhood. They came upon Ballard a few minutes later, crouched behind a telephone pole and shot him. A search of Ballard's clothing revealed, in addition to the bat, a pistol, a short iron bar, three coils of rope and a number of cartridges.

The man was later identified as a former inmate of the Michigan state prison at Jackson where he served a term for criminal assault. A notebook found in Ballard's clothing contained addresses of a number of Detroit children and their ages.

JARDINE SAYS CROP PROSPECTS BRIGHT

WASHINGTON, Mar. 19.—Crop prospects for this season are very bright, Secretary Jardine said today during a call at the White House, and he believes this is holding down market prices somewhat.

Mr. Jardine said he believed a plan being worked out by the federal farm loan board for making seed loans to farmers on warrants issued by counties, would prove successful.

There were indications, he said, that the farmers were accepting the veto of the McNary-Haugen farm bill in good spirit and were going ahead as usual with their spring planting.

WESTERN RAILWAY MEN DEMANDING \$1 PER DAY INCREASE

CHICAGO, Mar. 19.—The western railroads and their train service employees through their representatives today agreed to submit their wage question to arbitration. The request of the employees is for approximately one dollar a day increase.

The wage figure mentioned in the request for arbitration is the original demand and not the increase of 7 1/2 per cent granted by arbitration on the eastern roads. It is about twice the eastern figure finally awarded. Approximately 65,000 men are involved, the Order of Railway Conductors and the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen on these roads.
