AUTO LEAPS CLIFF NEARS PENDELTON; 3 PERSONS KILLED

(Associated Press Special Wire.)
PENDLETON, March 21.—Three persons were instantly killed Sunday morning when a heavy touring car left the Columbia River highway, five and a half miles west of Pendleton, and crashed down an almost vertical 175-foot bank to a rugged and rocky below. William L. Holt, 26, of Labor, Blue Line Stage company driver, Ben Griggs, 21, of Pendleton, and Barbara Watkins, 18, of Pendleton, were instantly killed when thrown on the rocks as the car somersaulted. Death was instantaneous, their heads being badly crushed. Helen Whitted, 22, the other girl in the party, was miraculously thrown clear of the car shortly before reaching the spot where it left a perpendicular cliff, and escaped with cuts and bruises. Her screams brought rescuers to the scene.

The car, which was used as a stage, was travelling at a high rate of speed when it hit the blind reverse curve. The machine seraped a rock retaining wall, shattered a guard fence and plunged down the slope where it was completely demolished.

SLAYER OF THREE OF DALTON GANG DIES IN KANSAS

COPEYVILLE, Kansas, March 21.—John Joseph Kloehr, 63, expert marksman, who gained fame when he killed three members of the Dalton gang of bank robbers in 1892, died here yesterday. Kloehr was brought to Kansas from Germany by his parents more than 50 years ago. He soon became known as an expert marksman and when the Dalton gang raided the two banks here in October, 1892, Kloehr joined a posse and exchanged shots with the bandits as they ran for their horses. He killed Bob and Grat Dalton and Bill Broadwell, leader of the gang, which had terrorized the west. He received rewards from ex-
