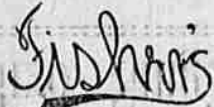

JACKSON COUNTY BANK TAKES OVER GOLD HILL BANK

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) MEDFORD, Ore., April 1—By a deal completed yesterday, the Jackson County Bank of this city, and the Fidelity Bank of Gold Hill, were consolidated and the Fidelity Bank ceased operation. The consolidation was officially approved by the state banking board, and officers of the two institutions, last night with the formal transfer of assets today.

It was announced that Walter Zimmerman, president of the Fidelity Bank, would open a bank in Chiloquin, Klamath county, at an early date.

By the change, the Jackson County Bank acquires approximately \$75,000 in deposits and 300 additional customers.

"This phrase presents a judicial question which the secretary of state as an administrative officer is not required to determine," Kozar states, "and it is suggested that for the purpose of expediting the determination by the supreme court of any legal question involved, appropriate steps be taken by you in order that such questions be passed upon by the court."

GERMANY REMITS ON REPARATIONS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) BERLIN, April 1—In accordance with the Dawes agreement, the bank for German industrial obligations today handed 125,000,000 marks to the agent general for reparation payments.

The sum represents the first half-yearly installment of interest due for the third reparation year on the mortgage on German industry of five billion marks.

GERMAN GENERAL DIES AFTER ROW WITH BERLIN COP

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) BERLIN, April 1—General Von Weisberg, 64, died from a heart attack today after an altercation with a policeman.

The altercation arose when the policeman requested the general to refrain from delivering a speech at the Bismarck monument, near the reichstag, to former officers observing the 112th anniversary of the birth of Bismarck. The policeman pointed out that the law forbade demonstrations within a mile of the reichstag.
