KING FERDINAND STILL ALIVE BUT DEATH IS NEARER

To Be Followed on Throne
by Grandson, Now Five
Years Old; Regency
Till He Is 18.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

PARIS, April 5.—King Ferdinand of Rumania today was fighting a losing battle in his efforts to overcome the ravages of his ailment.

This was apparent even from the laconic bulletins issued at his bedside at Bucharest, but the latest reliable information to reach Paris from the Rumanian capital indicated that death was only a question of days, perhaps hours.

The national peasants' party seemed inclined to rally to this situation of the situation. It has given up the idea of bringing back former Crown Prince Carol to rule in case of the death of Ferdinand. The party decided to accept the appointment by constitutional act of last year of Prince Michael, Carol's five-year-old son, as heir apparent to the throne and also the regency provided for by the act to take charge of affairs should Ferdinand die. The regency would rule until Michael was 18 years old.

Nicholas Jorga, leader of the dissident section, issued an appeal to all groups to unite and thus discourage political adventures and inspire respect for Rumania beyond her frontiers.

Carol remained today at his villa in Neully, to which he returned yesterday with his inamorata, Magda Lupescu, after a mysterious journey in his limousine which some persons believed would take him to the Lebourget flying field, whence he would go by plane to Rumania or some spot near the border to await eventualities in Bucharest.

Bound by his word of honor that he would not return to Rumania without permission, Carol was waiting disconsolately today the arrival of a summons to his father's bedside.

EARL CARROLL IN MARTYR POSE AS PEN GATES YAWN

NEW YORK, April 5.—Convinced that he has been sacrificed to make a tabloid holiday, and expressing confidence that executive clemency will be extended him as soon as this is understood, Earl Carroll began putting his theatrical house in order today in preparation for going to Atlanta penitentiary.

"I am a creation of the tabloids," he said in his little office at the Earl Carroll theatre just off the stage where his "bath tub party" was held a year ago, Washington's birthday.

"That is the figure of me held up before the public in this case. It isn't really me at all, just a stuffed puppet set up by the tabloids for the purpose of knocking me down."

"There is no question in my mind of whining. I hope I am man enough, and good citizen enough, to take my medicine without whimpering, but it all seems entirely futile to me. By conviction quiet plainly was the outcome of public hysteria incited by printed accounts which broke all records for sensational journalism."

How to Keep Young

One of our correspondents—a teacher—describes the idea of going to summer school and learning a lot of things about all the some-thing which new-fangled pedagogy would attempt to teach her. She advocates that teachers during the summer be turned out to grass, to recreate and be recreated instead of attending summer sessions forced upon them by school boards and officious superintendents. She goes on to state that pupils need more old-fashioned drill and less of the present soft pedagogy.

I picture this teacher conscientiously, marking papers far into the night, laboring over her monthly reports and yet internally seething with repressions, inhibitions and hates.

I see her when she first entered the school room—fresh from college, attractive, full of spirit and hope, ambitious to do and to be. Now I see lines which run down from the mouth, lines across the forehead, lines in the face, lines marking disappointments, disillusionment, discontent.

The System Got Her. I grant it. But what system? I say the Life System. Life will get anyone if allowed. Life brings disappointment, disillusionment and discontent to those who lose their youth.

The superintendent of schools did not take away her youth, nor the principal, nor the supervisor, nor the children. The latter spoke with their youthful laughter, enthusiasm and general kiddishness, begging her to keep her youth. But no. The System Got Her. The system of worry, doubt, self-distrust, distrust of others, and fear. Youth is not a time of life—it is a state of mind. It is not a matter of ripe cheeks, red lips and supple knees; it is a temper of the will, a quality of the imagination, a vigor of the emotions; it is a freshness of the deep springs of life. Youth means a temperamental predominance of courage over

fear, of the appetite of adventure over love of ease. This often exists in a woman of fifty, more than in a boy of twenty. Nobody grows old by merely living a number of years; people grow old by deserting their ideals.

Years wrinkle the skin, but to give up enthusiasm wrinkles the soul.

Worry, doubt, self-distrust, fear and despair—these are the long, long years that bow the head and turn the growing spirit back to dust.

Whether seventy or sixteen, there is in every being's heart the love of wonder, the sweet amazement at the stars and the star-like things and thoughts, and undimmed challenge of events, the unfulfilling child-like appetite for what next, and the joy and the game of life.

You, my friend, are as young as your faith, as old as your doubt; as young as your self-confidence, as old as your fear; as young as your hope, as old as your despair.

In the central place of your heart there is a wireless station; so long as it relays messages of beauty, hope, cheer, courage and power from the earth, from men and from the infinite, so long are you young. When the wires are all down and all the central place of your heart is covered with the snows of pessimism and the ice of cynicism, then are you grown old indeed and may God have mercy on your soul.

Please, dear lady, go to summer school, to camp, on a hike, across the country hitching your way; fall in love, play with youth, forget those old-fashioned drills; buy a bungalow, adopt a child, lead a group of girls—play hooky, run away from yourself—striving over again the wires which are down.
