MISSIONARIES IN CHINA IN NO DANGER LOCAL PEOPLE TOLD

Reassurances that the missionaries in the Canton and other South China mission points are safe and that there is no cause for anxiety on their behalf have been received by Attorney and Mrs. Albert Abraham, whose daughter, Dorothea, is an instructor in the Presbyterian school at Canton. Friends of Miss Abraham will be glad to learn that she is in no danger. The message states that all of the mission forces have been concentrated at Canton with the exception of two men who are at nearby points. The missionaries are provided with protection and at any time, should danger threaten, can be withdrawn to points protected by American and British forces. Adequate funds have been placed in the hands of mission authorities to permit evacuation should such a course become necessary.

In a statement of the situation the mission board of the Presbyterian church urges that the missionary policy in China be made stronger than ever. Instead of withdrawing from the field the forces should be strengthened, the leaders declare. Leading men of the Chinese nation are quoted as emphasizing the need of a stabilizing force such as Christianity during the upheaval and the sweeping change which China is now facing.

FRIGIDAIRE LINE MEETS HOME NEEDS

A new line of porcelain cabinets, for household refrigeration use is now being offered by Frigidaire corporation, according to an announcement received by J. C. Burg, local dealer.
