GRANGE FAVORS CHANGES OREGON, NATIONAL BODIES

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

CORVALLIS, Ore., June 15—Elimination of the short, or "lame duck" session of congress thru adoption of the Norris amendment providing that the congressman take office in January following election, is favored by the Oregon state grange in session at Oregon Agriculture College here. A resolution to this effect was adopted today with little debate. The resolution was sent here by the Washington state grange, by which it was adopted last week. Another resolution adopted without reference to committee endorsed A. L. Goss state grange master of Washington, for membership on the board of directors on the Branch Land Bank at Spokane when it is reorganized next month. In a group of resolutions presented today, dealing mostly with matters of the grange organization, was one favoring addition by Oregon of the federal method of representation in the state legislature. This plan, recently adopted in California, provides that each county, regardless of size, elect one senator. Representatives are twice the number of senators, and are apportioned according to population, but with no man representing more than two counties. This change, admittedly designed to lessen the power of Portland in the legislature, was expected to

be approved after consideration by the resolutions committee. Vote on the place of meeting next year is scheduled for tomorrow, with Rainier, Bend and Oregon City competing for favor. Corvallis was host to the visitors last night with an outdoor banquet on the campus, attended by more than 7,000 persons.

LINDBERGH SEES HIS FORMER CHUM LOSE GLOVE BOUT

NEW YORK, June 15—Two fights of the kind every boxing fan dreams of, but seldom sees, so down in the annals of the ring as the fruit of a single evening.

In battles that were vicious in their fistic singularity, Sergeant Sammy Baker stopped Ace Hudkins and Sid Torres knocked out Ruby Goldstein at the Polo Grounds last night. Forty thousand fans whose admission money went to help the cause of the Catholic Boys' clubs looked on and howled and whooped. Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh was at the ring side as guest of Mayor Walker.

Whether for sweet charity's sake, or whether to impress the world champion of the air, Colonel Lindbergh, every one of the four was fighting the battle of his life. More than ever before in his ring career, Ace Hudkins wanted to win that fight. He and Lindbergh had known each other in Lincoln, Nebraska, back when "Lindy" was learning to fly and Ace to fight. But the flying sergeant from Mitchell Field, N. Y., was too much for the ace, despite his high hopes and ambitions, and he lost on a technical knockout.

Even more dramatic than the welterweight fight was the lightweight battle between New York's two ghetto boys.

At the bell Goldstein drove from his corner, high flying youth personified, and a moment later smashed a right to the chin. Down went Torres, while the referee tolled the count to nine. Then slowly he dragged to his feet again and from the rear at his heels he brought a crushing right hand blow that landed flush in the corner, quivering youngster's chin and knocked him out. The bout was 13 seconds less than two minutes old.

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PIONEER FAMILY HOLDS REUNION

The family of the late Judge M. D. Thompson were reunited for the first time in twenty-one years at the home of W. E. Thompson in Wilbur, Saturday and Sunday, June 11 and 12. The last time that the family were all together was at the old Thompson home, Oak Knoll farm on the Umpqua river, seven miles east of Scottsburg in August, 1906, five years previous to the death of the father, Judge Thompson, September 7, 1911. M. D. Thompson was commissioner of Douglas county from 1894 to 1900, when he was appointed to the judgeship of Douglas county to succeed Judge Lyons, resigned. M. D. Thompson was elected to the judgeship which he held until 1906 when he moved with his family from Roseburg to Oak Knoll farm.

The mother of the children, Mrs. M. D. Thompson, moved from Oak Knoll farm to Corvallis, Oregon, in 1912, and has lived there ever since. Mrs. W. G. Grubbe, the eldest daughter, who was living on a farm at Long Prairie, in 1906, is now living in Albany, Oregon. Mrs. E. F. O'Rourke, the second daughter, who was enroute to Idaho in August, 1906, is now living in Rio Dell, California. W. E. Thompson, the only son, lived on Oak Knoll farm until April, 1921, when he moved to Wilbur, Oregon, where he has lived since. The youngest daughter, Mrs. H. D. Butler, was married at the home farm, January 20, 1903, is now living on a farm in the Umpqua valley ten miles east of Reedsport, Oregon.

Besides the immediate family, Mrs. M. D. Thompson, Mrs. W. G. Grubbe, Mrs. E. F. O'Rourke, W. E. Thompson, and Mrs. H. D. Butler. The other members of the family at the reunion were Mrs. W. E. MAD BULL IS LEADING INDIANS IN MARATHON

SANTA ROSA, Calif., June 16—Mad Bull, Karok Indian, at 1:30 a. m., today was in the van of the eleven Indians who left San Francisco Tuesday morning on a 480-mile marathon to Grants Pass, Oregon. He passed thru Hopland, 52 miles north of here, at that time two miles ahead of Falcon, in second place, who in turn was leading Flying Cloud by a quarter of a mile. Bunched within seven miles farther back were five other Indians, including two of the Zunis, Melika and Chochee, both going strong.

Jamon, the third Zuni, was forced, by badly blistered feet to stop 9 miles north of here, at Robins Nest, and return for treatment. However, he soon resumed running.
