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MAJOR LEAGUE RESULTS

Fading after failing to beat the Pirates in their two-game duel for the lead, the Cubs, who recently won 12 games straight, have now dropped four in a row, three of which went to fatten the averages of the rising Cardinals. The latest was won yesterday, 11 to 5, and gave the Cards a clean sweep of the Cubs series. It was a personal triumph for Grover Cleveland Alexander.

Still out in front and holding their own, the Pirates unloaded their hitting howitzers and dropped the Reds by 11 to 9.

Babe Ruth's 23rd and 24th homers in the first game helped the Yanks to their seven to four victory over the Red Sox and made him all even with his home run showing for the same point in 1921, his record year. The 3 to 2 decision in the second game was one on a minimum of hitting with Shocker out-throwing his opponent, ruling.

At Thomas scored his 11th victory of the season in pitching the second place Sox to an 8 to 5 victory over the Browns in the second game of their double bill. The first was lost in 10 innings 3 to 2.

Fighting the Athletics for their third place running, the Senators bested them in the first session 4 to 2, on the pitching of the rookie, Lisenbee, who has now won 9 games, but lost the advantage in a 13 to 7 defeat as the A's slugged 15 hits off two less potent pitchers.

The Oaks received a dose of their own medicine yesterday, when Larry French, Portland's rookie southpaw, shut them out, 3-0. The kid left-hander pitched superbly in the pinches, eight Oakland hits being wasted. Batteries: Hasty, Craghead and Read, Boot; French and Fischer.

After setting the Seals down without a hit for five innings, Wee
